Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

"Allow God's Living Water Flow Through You"

Today we celebrate not just the dedication of a great church in Rome, but a profound truth: God dwells among His people. In the vision of Ezekiel, a river of living water flows from the temple, bringing life to everything it touches. That water represents the grace of God that longs to flow through us. We must ask ourselves: does that living water flow from our parish—bringing hope, forgiveness, and love to the world—or have we blocked its path with fear, gossip, or indifference?

St. Paul reminds us with startling clarity: "You are God's temple, and the Spirit of God dwells in you." Every person, every family, and our entire parish community are sacred dwellings of the Lord. When we act with selfishness, anger, or division, we damage that temple; but when we love, serve, and forgive one another, we rebuild it. Holiness is not measured by walls of stone but by the way we live each day—with kindness, compassion, and faithfulness.

In the Gospel, Jesus cleanses the temple because it had become a marketplace, forgetting its true purpose as a house of prayer. We too must ask: have we turned our faith into a routine, a transaction, or a comfort zone? Or is our parish truly a place of encounter—a space where people meet the living God, feel His mercy, and are transformed by His Spirit?

As we celebrate this feast, let us renew our commitment to make St. Bartholomew's Parish a living temple of God's presence. May our worship be sincere, our service generous, and our hearts open. Let living waters of grace flow from this community into Yonkers and beyond—bringing life where there is dryness, unity where there is division, and hope where there is despair. Then our church will truly become a visible sign of a people alive in Christ.

Tuesday, November 11th, we honor our veterans, worthy men and women who gave their best when they were called upon to serve and protect their country.




We pray that you will bless them for their unselfish service in the continual struggle to preserve our freedoms, our safety, and our country's heritage, for all of us.
