

A Note from Pastor Toni

The holidays will quickly be upon us. Thanksgiving will be here before we know it and Christmas is just around the corner (where did October go?!) As is true for me every year, I am already thinking and planning for Christmas; the sermon series and how we can reach and invite people to share the birth of the Savior with us on Christmas Eve and on the streets. Recent studies show only half of Americans plan to attend church on Christmas, which means having a full house on Christmas Eve is no longer guaranteed. So, what is the best way for our church community to see the most visitors this year? I'd like to suggest a few ways that all of us can implement and participate in this Christmas Season.

*<u>Personal Invitations</u> – Each of you is still the best way to fill the church by inviting your neighbors and friends. When I'm looking for a plumber or a good mechanic I ask the people I trust the most. People trust those they know for recommendations, so why not recommend and share with them Christmas at YUMC? Studies show that 80% of un-churched people will come to church <u>if</u> a friend invites them! I know that sometimes people are reluctant to invite their friends. I have said many times before that it usually takes at least three invitations before someone will respond. So, I want to make this as easy as I can for all of us. This year, as we have done in the past, there will be a small invitation card with the basic information for our Christmas Eve services as well as our Tailgate Street Service so that you can hand your neighbors and friends an invite card. But don't stop there. Post one on your bulletin board at the office or hand them with a smile and a "hope you'll join me," to the local business people you work with regularly. Pray about who God wants you to invite. You may be surprised at what you hear. Respond. Follow through. And leave the rest to the Holy Spirit!

<u>*Social Media</u> – Post your Christmas invitation on your Facebook or Instagram page. Don't just post the invitation, include a thoughtful, attractive and inspirational message about Christmas or even a short video. I read recently that the average person spends nearly two hours a day on social media - and there are ads everywhere! Which means that people get desensitized to anything that even LOOKS like an ad. A recent study done by Pew research indicated that fewer people today believe in the key elements of the Christmas story (virgin birth, baby laid in a manger, angel announcements, wise men guided by a star) – Share your personal beliefs about the Christmas story. It would probably get people talking and sharing which is the whole point of social media!

Church, we must be intentional about reaching out to our community during this special time of the year. This year let's make strategic and intentional choices to share Christmas—the birth of our Savior and the reason for our hope—with everyone we can!

Celebrate Recovery

Happy Fall Everyone! John and I can't believe that this month we will be starting Celebrate Recovery. That's this Friday November 2nd at 6:00 P.M. We will be having meetings every Friday night this month except the day after Thanksgiving. We have been able to get materials and be able to be set to help people within our community get free from any hurts, habits or hang ups within there lives. I have posted some flyers in areas around town and Michael has been able to put the announcement in the newspaper.

We have decided that we will be doing monthly updates and testimony's, so our church can see our success and see how we are growing. We will be starting out, of course, small and pray for bigger things to come as we embark on this journey. We want to thank everyone who is helping get this project going. Any donation can be taken on Sundays with Celebrate Recovery listed in the memo or be given to Michael.

We are excited to share the worship that will be happening as well as working with the CR curriculum and get everyone on the same page and work together on a weekly basis. I came across this scripture: James 4:7 Submit yourselves then to God, Resist the Devil, and he will flee from you. We are going to start small in Siskiyou and get people to see the light within recovery. I wanted to share my experience with CR a little more in-depth, so everyone can understand that this is not for just alcohol and drug addictions. When I went to CR in Santa Rosa in 2017 with John I thought I would be going as the emotional support. And to build up the women from the other recovery place as well to show them that there are good people within the world. While John was in the Redwood Gospel mission for ten months I attended 12 CR meetings with him.

By the last one I finally realized that I was suffering too. I saw what I needed to recover from and that was resentment. Being in a toxic relationship for the past 14 years I realized that I felt like I resented myself as well as John resenting me for his addiction. Because of CR ,I was able to surpass that as well as forgive myself and John for what had happened within our lives. For the past, year I have been invited to meet with Youth Pastors and Pastors from Fort Jones Community/Scott Valley Berean, Yreka Nazarene, Four Square, and Grenada Berean to help plan an annual youth event held at the Yreka Nazarene Church October 12,13,14, 2018! This annual event has taken place for close to twenty years, and is open to all 6th-12th grade youth in Siskiyou County. "Kaleo" in the Greek means "to call" The intent of Kaleo is to bring vouth to salvation and encourage them to be active in a church in Siskiyou County. 
