Greetings to ALL. As I am writing this, the fall harvest has started at the farm. It is my favorite time of year. After the seeds were planted this spring and then you watch them emerge and then worry all growing season if we are getting enough rain or too much rain. Every time you hear that we are supposed to get storms and they are predicting high winds and hail and my gut just sinks and I start praying that all will be well. We have been so far more than blessed this growing season. Rains came when we needed it, the crops were not damaged by storms and even though I don't like the heat, it was great for the crops. We started chopping corn last week and the harvest is bountiful. The cows should have plenty to eat. We give God thanks for all that we are receiving, and may it continue to be good, and ALL who are involved in the harvest be safe.

I am grateful for all that we have been blessed with. However, there is a silent story that is going on out west that I would like to bring to light to ask for prayers for those individuals and families who are being affected by this. Due to the current conditions of the United States, the export market for Agriculture commodities has decreased dramatically. China is a very large importer of American Agricultural goods, however, due to the current status of things, China is purchasing much of their Agricultural needs elsewhere. Due to this, out west there are many grain elevators that are still full from last year and farmers have been notified that the elevators will be taking in very little to none of the crops that were grown this year. So, as a result, unless you have your own storage facilities there are no places to go with the crops you grew. I became aware of this after Max went out west for a week a couple of weeks ago to help the guy he worked for last year as a combine operator. I was made aware of this again when someone I know that works as a farm mental health counselor, along with other people, were asked to go out west to help with the suicide crisis of American farmers. There isn't much in this world that saddens me; however, for me this hits home and is very personal. Agriculture is one of the few sectors in the world where you have no control of whether there will be a market for the products you grow or produce and you as the producer of those products can't set the price you receive for what you produce. You are at the mercy of those that are much higher in the process. However, a person cannot live without food. Please pray that these individuals who feel that there is no other way out of this than by ending one's life, that there is help and give them the ability to reach out to find solutions other than suicide. We pray to God to send the Holy Spirit upon them to find solutions, and no matter the situation let them know they are worthy of being all that God created them to be and that they are important and worthy of being human. Please, if you know of anyone who is in need of mental support or is having a mental health crisis, share that 988 is a National Suicide Crisis line available to anyone at any time, 24/7, and it is free.

I would like to thank everyone who is involved in leading our youth in their Christian education and teaching this year. Thank You ALL for your time energy and dedication to the youth of Chimney Rock to see that they be offered Christian education and formation. Your role is vital to the Faith Formation of these young individuals and what you do does <u>not</u> go unnoticed. May God send the Holy Spirit upon you All in your use of your gifts that were given to you by the Holy Spirit to teach the young about God. These educational instructors are: Sunday School Superintendent and Middle School Teacher Jennifer Perry, Elementary School Teacher Rachael Hovey, Confirmation Teacher Randy Olson and all the parents that were willing to fill in for Jennifer while she is attending to other obligations.

I am sure Barb will have all the information about the 155th Anniversary Celebration happening at Chimney Rock on October 19, 2025. I look forward to this event and meeting everyone that attends this celebration.

Call to Order—Trustee Forrest Nutter called the Monday, September 15, 2025, meeting to order at 6:26pm. Members present: Monica Dejno, Jerry Erickson, Richard Gunderson, Barb McGee, Forrest Nutter, Mary Olson, Pastor David Sands, Dan Solfest, and Barb Sylla. Don Solfest was absent.

Devotions—Pastor Sands read various verses from Luke 16:1-13 and led in discussion. Monica shared an opening prayer.

Monica gave her report at this time, since she had to leave at 7pm. Tonight is the first of six online webinars throughout the ELCA relating to the Castle Project Grant, which is proceeding very quickly. Synod Authorized Ministers will each receive \$250 scholarships through this project. Every SAM in the Northwest Synod has a mentor, and the number of SAMs in this synod keeps increasing. This past weekend, the lay school classes resumed. Monica also shared that she has ordered the pulled pork for the 155th Anniversary from Bushy's and will soon order the potato salad at Family Farms.
