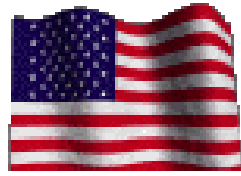

IASMC Meeting Minutes—July 6, 2014

Best Western Nicollet Inn—Burnsville, MN

The Annual General Membership meeting of the International Association of Shrine Motor Corps was called to order at the Best Western Premier Hotel, Burnsville, MN on Sunday July 6th, 2014 at 3:30pm by President Jack T. Knight. An invocation was led by 2nd VP Howard Helwig and the Shrine Pledge by Pres. Jack Knight. The head table of seven (7) IASMC Officers, all present, was introduced. IASMC Past Presidents, eight (8) in attendance including Ardys Bennett, Medd Box, Bruce James, James Mitch, Don Shaffer, David Vaughn, Roy Wilson and Woody Woodward were next introduced, followed by special guests Steve Phelps of Sharon Temple and Ed Reiners of Zuhrah Temple. Noble Reiners efforts in securing and setting our competition field, arranging our hotel quarters and other contributions in setting up the weekend's events were particularly noted. Additional introductions included various current and present officers of regional associations such as SEASMC, MWASMC, CSASMC, FASMC and GLASMC as well as all Potentates, Past Potentates and other Divan members who were in attendance. The Sergeant at Arms, Dennis Green, reported that there were 61 nobles present representing 19 temples and a total of 34 votes.

The minutes of the prior year's general membership and midwinter meetings were waived being read and voted accepted as published in the Cakras and Wheel on the www.iasmc.net website. The Secretary Treasurer's report was given by Jay Alfirevic and noted that the association was in a solid financial position with approximately \$15,000 in the account net balance and that the required annual fidelity bond had been renewed and the IRS 990N post card return had been filed with the IRS and submitted to Imperial. Membership was at 350 members pending minor changes for walk in registrations taken that morning at the meeting entrance. Subsequent to the meeting the required annual audit was performed by President Jack Knight, President Elect Danny Garcia and Past President Ardys Bennett and the association's books were reported as being in appropriate order. Noble Alfirevic also called on Past President Bruce James to note GLASMC's upcoming competitions to be held in Fairview Heights IL, near St Louis, on September 11-13, 2014.

Additional reports were given by each officer. Sergeant at Arms Dennis Green, along with Luke Baker noted that SouthEast Association was holding an event in Jacksonville, FL on August 6-9 and FASMC in Cocoa Beach on August 22-24 and invited all to attend. 3rd Vice President Mike McLaughlin welcomed all to Minneapolis on behalf of his home Temple Zuhrah and noted that Midwest Competitions are to be held in Sioux Falls, SD August 22&23. He also recognized and thanked the local Lakeville MN Harley dealership for their donation and staffing of a booth on the competition field to supply water to the participants and spectators. 2nd Vice President Howard Helwig expressed his compliments to Pres Jack Knight on his midwinter meeting last March in Houston and noted that his would be held in Colonial Williamsburg VA in mid March 2017 with Imperial to be held in Daytona Beach in July 2017. 1st Vice President L.P. Brown indicated his midwinter meeting would be in Orlando March 24-27, 2016 with Imperial to be held in Tampa in July 2016. President Elect Danny Garcia indicated that 2015's midwinter meeting will be held in San Antonio March 19-22, 2015 with the Imperial Session to be held in downtown Houston at the George R. Brown Convention Center with a unique Indoors Competition.

Time and logistics of the upcoming competition, field location and other details were discussed. The attendees were reminded of recently passed rules that expand Class 5 to consider Make, Model and Color and allow minor variations across years. The discussion of the newly created Show Class was also discussed, but it was noted that only 1 vehicle had registered for this new class this year, and then subsequently withdrew due to lack of participation. The officers will consider whether or not to continue to promote and develop this in future years at Midwinter. A motion was made, seconded and passed to change IASMC membership requirements to open them up and no longer restrict membership to only organized "units" and allow a new class of special members who could join as members and participate in show class or individual obstacle or slow race. Drills would still require a minimum of four (4) on a drill team. The new wording accepted is as follows: "Section 2D Special membership: Is one who is a member in good standing with his temple and an active member with this association". Dues would be \$10 per year, the same as all other membership classes.

A motion was made, seconded and passed that all current officers be advanced one position. A nomination was received from Bob Sides, Past President CSASMC that Ed Raper, Sesostris, be considered for the Sergeant at Arms role. Noble Raper had previously submitted his candidacy in writing to the officers and attended the midwinter meeting in Houston. No other nominations were made and Noble Raper was elected by acclamation and accepted the position. Past President Ardys Bennett made a motion that was seconded and passed that Jay Alfirevic be elected to another 3 year term as Secretary Treasurer for the 2015, 2016 and 2017 years. Noble Alfirevic was re-elected by acclamation and accepted. (Note: All officers were subsequently duly installed and sworn in by Past President Medd Box at the Tuesday July 8, 2014 Awards Banquet which was attended by approximately 220 nobles, family and friends. Donations and 50/50 raffle at the banquet generated a total of \$907, which the association increased to a round \$1,000 contribution to the Shriners Hospital For Children—Twin Cities location.)

The meeting was adjourned at 5:30pm.
