Virtual meeting reveals student locations

With the encouragement of emcee Tammy Nguyen Lee, seven student honorees of Southwest Jewish Congress (SWJC) revealed where they are and the impact their awards have had on their lives, at the June 1 SWJC annual meeting. Since 2014, SWJC has been honoring inspiring youth. The honorees who attended this international Zoom meeting included these young-adult awardees: Zach Bernstein, Zachary Denn, Teresa Balderas Flores, Matthew Johnson, Esha Kothapalli, Leah Prager and Graham Rosen. At the SWJC meeting, a new slate of board members and officers was installed for next year, along with the announcement of outstanding, complimentary programs for the fall.

In addition to interviewing the youths, Tammy Nguyen Lee, founder of the nonprofit, Against The Grain Productions, led the Q&A from former SWJC adult award recipients. Ms. Lee, an award winning producer and director, was born in Saigon and fled Vietnam as a boat person with her mother when she was 3 months old. An honor graduate of SMU, she received her Master
