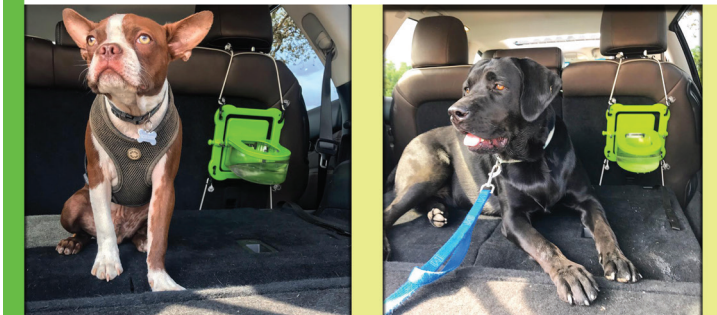

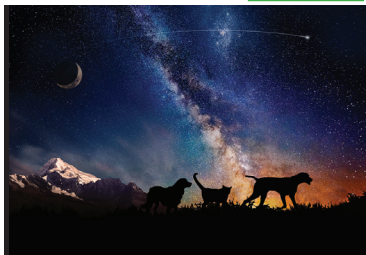

Jeff Guidry's incredible story of rehabilitating an eagle named Freedom bringing her back from the brink of death.

"Not many people get a picture of this proud bird snuggled up next to them! Freedom and I have been together 11 years. She's my baby. When she came in as a baby (1998) she had two broken wings, couldn't stand up, was emaciated and covered in lice. We made the decision to give her a chance at life, so I took her to the vet's office. From that point on we have been together. We kept her in a huge dog carrier with the top off and shredded newspaper to lay in. We used a tube to feed her for weeks. I would sit and talk to her, urging her to live, to fight; and she would lay there looking at me with those big brown eyes. This went on for 4-6 weeks, but she couldn't stand, the decision was made to eutha-



nize her if she couldn't stand in a week. It looked like death was winning. She was to be put down on Friday. I was supposed to go in Thursday, but didn't want to because I couldn't bear what might happen. When I got there everyone was grinning. I went back to her cage and she was standing on her own, a big beautiful eagle. She was ready to live. We knew she could never fly again, so the director asked me to glove train her. We began doing education programs for schools in western Washington, and were in newspapers, on TV, radio and Miracle Pets did a show about us.

In early 2000, I was diagnosed with stage 3 non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, I did eight months of chemo and missed a lot of work. If I felt good, I'd go to Sarvey and take Freedom for walks. Freedom came to me in my dreams helping me fight the cancer. In November 2000, I went for my last checkup and was told if the cancer was still there, my last option was a stem cell transplant. They did the tests and when I returned to the office was told the cancer was gone. The first thing I did was go to Sarvey and take the big girl for a walk and took her to the top of a hill. I hadn't said a word to Freedom, but she knew. She put her wings around me and touched my face with her beak. It was a special moment. People come up to us all the time when we're out and say there is something unique about her. I never forget the honor I have of being close to such a magnificent spirit as Freedom! I hope you enjoy this story! Make sure your animals are current on vaccinations. We want them healthy because they're a big part of our lives." ■
