With the new Sunday morning worship service starting soon, I need your help! Churches can spend lots of money on advertising...and that can be a great thing. But the truth of the matter is that THE BEST WAY as church grows is through word of mouth- one person telling one person. Someone can read an article in the paper or see a sign about a church, think, "That's nice!"...and then go on their merry way. But they are MUCH more likely to respond when someone they know says, "Hey, I'd like to invite you to this thing we have going at my church."

Here are my challenges for YOU:

1. agree to attend the new service for 6 months. DON'T give up the service you already attend- it's no help if we simply "rob Peter to pay Paul"! Instead, add the new one to your morning routine.

2. Between now and the end of September, invite one NEW person EACH week to try out this new service. ONE new one EACH week. If we all did that...there wouldn't even be room for everybody! How awesome would THAT be?!

3. Pray. Pray. Pray that God will anoint this new service, those who are leading it AND those who will be trying it out. Pray that it reaches folks for Jesus Christ who aren't yet being reached. Pray that it is pleasing to God.

I simply DON'T have a gear for the church NOT growing- it doesn't make sense to me. We have the BEST message in the world. We have been changed by the power of Jesus Christ in ways we could have never imagined. We should desperately desire that others might have that same experience. And they won't have that opportunity...if we don't tell them about it!

CURRENT/NEW SERMON SERIES

On Sunday, July 12, we started a very interesting and unusual...experiment- <u>U Pick 'Ems</u>! Every week, the folks in the pews have had the choice of three Bible characters. They vote on which one they want to see the next week. And THAT'S the one I preach on! But instead of a normal "sermon", each week's message is a monologue from the character themselves. Some of the characters that don't get picked have "slid" down to become choices in later weeks. The remaining weeks of the series look like this:

Sunday, August 7- Week 4, New Testament

Choices: Nicodemus' complex relationship with Jesus

Thomas says what we all think

Joseph of Arimathea claims Jesus' body

Sunday, August 14- Week 5, Old Testament

Choices: Samuel reflects on his call Jonah and the big fish Job experiences great suffering

Then, on Sunday, August 21, we start a new worship service (in "Soft Launch") AND a new series-<u>Do-ing a 180</u>. How many times have you realized that the direction you were headed was not the right one...but you weren't sure which way WAS the right one? In this short, 3-week series, we'll look at Mary Magdalene- one of the greatest transformation stories in the Bible- and see what she has to tell us about turning our lives around for Jesus Christ. The weeks of the series look like this:

Sunday, August 21- Accept What Is (Luke 8:1-2)

To be able to turn around, you first have to realize and embrace where you are. (Proverbs 28:10-14a, 1John 1:6-9)

Sunday, August 28- <u>Redefine Yourself</u> (John 19:25)

Who you ARE isn't nearly as important as who you COULD be.

(Isaiah 65:17-18, Romans 8:1-2)

Sunday, September 4- <u>Be Patient</u> (Mark 16:1-3)

Patience may be bitter, but its fruit is sweet.

(Isaiah 40:29-31, Romans 8:23b-25)

Come each week expecting God to speak to you in powerful ways!

The Bread Monk is Coming!



On Wednesday, August 17, a very special event will happen. Father Dominic- The Bread Monk- will be visiting us! An old friend of Rev. Mark's, Father Dom is an awarding-winning author and host of the popular Breaking Bread With Father Dominic TV show that ran on PBS from 1999-2001. Dinner will be at 5:15PM, followed by a presentation by Father Dom at 6PM-

People are hungry for many things---food, fellowship, healing, knowledge, encouragement---and above all, the Good News. Fr. Dom offers a reflection on Jesus' multiplication of the loaves, and explains how different breads are symbolic of the great diversity of spiritual gifts and Christian service. Find out what kind of bread YOU can be to feed the various hungers of the world! Father Dominic Garramone, OSB is a monk of Saint Bede Abbey in Peru IL.

He is the head of the Religion department at Saint Bede Academy and teaches church history and Christian doctrine. He is also the drama director and has published two plays. He was the host of the PBS cooking show "Breaking Bread with Father Dominic" from 1999 to 2001 and has written six cookbooks. His newest book, a beginner's baking book titled <u>The Breadhead Bible</u>, was published by Reedy Press. His first children's book, <u>Brother Jerome and the Angels in the Bakery</u>, was the recipient of the 2011 Christopher Award for Children's Books (ages 8 to 10) and the 2011 Catholic Press Association 1st Place Award for children's books. Fr. Dom says he got his culinary education "between my mother's kitchen, PBS and the public library" and when not baking or teaching can usually be found in the abbey herb garden.

PLEDGING AND TITHING WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?

At Aledo United Methodist Church, we know that financial stewardship is an important component of a balanced spiritual life. We emphasize the giver's need to give rather than the church's need to receive. Maintaining a healthy relationship with our possessions keeps them from getting in the way of our relationships with God, our neighbors, and our own inner being. Returning to god from that which God has given us is a tangible way to express our faith. When each of us gives as we are able, together we can fund our various ministries in Aledo and around the world.

WHAT IS A PLEDGE?

A pledge is an estimate of giving; some call it a statement of intent. Pledge amount may be changed, increased or decreased during the year, at any time as financial circumstances change.

WHY SHOULD I PLEDGE?

Pledging allows us to make intentional decisions about our financial giving. It is all about priorities! When we plan ahead for our giving, we make conscious choices about spending our money in ways that reflect our faith and values. The church sets a budget based largely on the amount of total pledges received. While regular giving that is not pledged is important to the church, our pledges let the church plan more accurately.

HOW DO I PLEDGE?

Our annual stewardship campaign is held each January but pledges may be made at any time. Pledge forms are available in the church office.

HOW DO I PAY MY PLEDGE?

Paying your pledge is a matter of personal preference. You may pay weekly, monthly, quarterly or yearly via cash, check, paypal, or through your financial institution's bill pay feature.

HOW MUCH SHOULD I PLEDGE?

Determining the amount of your annual pledge is between you and God. Only you know what you can give. The dollar amount is not the most important detail of your pledge. We want you to participate. We want you to do the best you can.

WHAT IS A TITHE?

A tithe is 10% of your income. A tithe may sound like an unattainable goal to begin with, but if you start with a certain proportion of your income and increase the percentage each year, you will be tithing in a short time. You could start with 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ %, which is equivalent to pledging the first hour's pay of a 40-hour week.

HOW WILL I KNOW HOW MUCH I HAVE GIVEN TO THE CHURCH?

The church prepares quarterly statements of giving for everyone that gives to the church. **GET STARTED!**

The amount of your pledge is not as important as is getting started.



BLOOD PRESSURE CHECKS

HOW IS OUR CHURCH DOING FINANCIALLY?

At our last Finance Committee meeting we decided that we needed to communicate better to our members concerning our church finances. So how is our church doing financially?

One way to answer that question is to compare our performance to our 2016 budget. Our budget for 2016 is \$316,244 and that is up \$12,918 over the 2015 budget. Our 2016 contributions through June are short of budget by \$12,656. When we compare our expenses through June we are underspent \$5,605 compared to budgeted expenses. As of the end of June we only owe a partial month of conference obligations.

The other way to compare our performance is to prior year(s). When we compare our financial situation to one year ago it looks better. Even though our budget went up, the good news is that our contributions through June are \$10,336 higher than 2015 and last year at the same time we owed two month of conference obligations. Pledges to our budget for 2016 increased \$9,216.00.

So, with all that said, how are we doing? When you just look at our 2016 performance we could be doing better but when we compare it to last year and other prior years we are doing quite well with posi-

tive performance everywhere you look. The good news is that the increase in the budget and the increase in contributions are providing measureable results in connecting people with Jesus Christ. Maybe that is how we should be comparing our financial performance. Every contribution, regardless of the amount, is helping to make that happen. Thank you for helping to keep the Aledo United Methodist Church Financially strong!

6 Signs Your Church Encourages Serving

1. <u>Gift-based service is a frequent topic in worship messages</u>. Your church has a weekly opportunity to cast the vision for equipping. Does the lead pastor promote the biblical message of the giftedness of all believers? Do people understand that the call to discipleship involves serving?

2. Lay people are regularly and visibly lifted up for their service in the church and community. For equipping church values to permeate the culture, you have to do more than talk about them. Stories about and by people involved in serving are key to building an equipping culture.

3. <u>Paid staff are evaluated more by how they equip others than by program goals</u>. Is staff challenged to increase the number of people involved in their ministry each year?

4. <u>The church is known for being involved with ministry in the community</u>. The natural outcome of healthy equipping churches includes involvement in community-transforming ministry.

5. Workplace and community involvement are seen as ministry. There is not a large division between sacred and secular service. Equipping is about people using their gifts in all that they do to glorify and serve God. That is part of the vision to cast in order to move toward whole life ministry.

6. When people are sick or need pastoral care, they are more likely to be ministered to (and expect to be ministered to) by other lay people rather than pastoral staff. A hospital visit from a lay person is seen as real ministry. The senior pastor is not expected to make every hospital call, shut-in visit, or worship guest follow-up.
