

LAKE AREA INFORMATION



The lake and gazebo are open for your enjoyment and a beautiful place to catch a sunset. The Chairman of Lake Committee monitors the lake and surrounding area, along with an Agent from the Auburn University Extension & Aquaculture Resource Service, annually testing the water to keep it safe and clean.

Frequently asked questions

- **HOW BIG IS THE LAKE?** About 8-1/2 acres - west 3rd averages 1 to 2 feet, the middle and east end 3'-6'. Most of the bottom is the same depth from bank to bank except for a channel, about 10' wide, that parallels the shore nearly all the way around. This channel is 20-25' out from the bank and is roughly 1' deeper than the surrounding bottom.
- **WHAT KEEPS THE WATER LEVEL UP?** Storm water runoff and seepage through the underground water table keeps the water level pretty stable. While the level can rise 1 or 2 feet after a heavy shower, it does drop quickly back to pre-storm levels.
- **IS THERE WILDLIFE?** Ducks and ducklings, heron and a variety of birds. Report sightings of alligators, beaver or nutria immediately. Never feed the fish or wildlife.
- **CAN WE GET ON THE LAKE?** By boat, manual or electric power only, with a kayak, paddle boat or canoe. No paddleboards, rafts, swimming or wading.
