"They will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit." – Jeremiah 8 (NIV)

Dear Friends,

Greetings to you in the mighty and holy name of the Lord Jesus Christ, our blessed Redeemer. As always, I pray this message finds you rejoicing in the joy of the Lord and resting in the peace of Christ, which surpasses all understanding. I also hope you each had a wonderful summer.

As for me, after thirty days of rest and renewal, I return with a heart full of gratitude—for the sacred pause and for the community that held steady in my absence. Thank you for your prayers, your trust, and your faithful presence. You reminded me that Sabbath is not a break from ministry, but a rhythm within it—a rhythm we share. That rhythm, held in stillness, has attuned my spirit to September's quiet invitations. As I reenter the rhythm we share, I find the world around us echoing that same invitation—soft, steady, and full of change.

The calendar and shifting light remind us that we are moving from summer's long, hazy days into the mixed temperatures, vibrant colors, and earthy scents of fall. September evokes beginnings and closings—but not endings. It is a season of transition: leaves turning from deep green to brilliant orange and gold, the sun rising later and setting earlier, and the fragrances of apples, cinnamon, and pumpkins replacing the fresh scent of lilacs and freshly cut grass.

Students and teachers return to the rhythms of learning and community—creating, growing, and discovering. Summer vacations end, pools close, and amusement

parks wind down. Baseball gives way to basketball and football—the rhythms of leisure shift, inviting us to listen for something quieter.

There's a gentle invitation in this turning—not to rush, but to reflect. Not to produce, but to prepare. In that spirit of preparation, I've revised this fall's theme to Equipped and Empowered, which calls us to consider what it means to be ready—not just in activity, but in spirit.

To help us "fall" into the theme, let's consider Jeremiah 17:8, where the prophet describes the people of God "like trees planted by water, sending out their roots by the stream." These trees do not fear drought or heat. They do not strive or scatter. They remain.

And in remaining, they bear fruit. We, too, are invited to remain—to root ourselves in God's presence and trust the fruit will come.

This fall, we are not being asked to do more, but to trust that where we are—this community, this moment, this ministry—is fertile ground. That the tools God has placed in our hands are enough. That our prayers, our presence, and our quiet acts of love and justice are not overlooked.

May God grant us the grace not to rush ahead, but to root deeper by being a congregation that trusts in slow growth, sacred stillness, and above all, in the Spirit's quiet work among us.

**LABOR DAY
SEPT. 1, 2025**

Labor Day, observed on the first Monday in September, honors American workers' contributions and started as a late 19th-century labor movement initiative. It became a federal holiday in 1894 and marks the unofficial end of summer.

Labor Day is an annual celebration of workers and their achievements which originated during one of American labor history's most dismal chapters.

During the late 1800s, amid the peak of the Industrial Revolution (change in economy to one dominated by industry and machine manufacturing) in the United States, the typical American employee worked twelve-hour days and seven-day weeks to secure a basic livelihood. Although some states imposed restrictions, children as young as five or six were employed in mills, factories, and mines nationwide, receiving only a small portion of the wages earned by adults.

Many people, especially the poor and new immigrants, often worked in unsafe conditions without enough fresh air, proper sanitation, or breaks.

As manufacturing replaced agriculture as America's main source of jobs, labor unions became more active, organizing strikes and rallies to improve working conditions, hours, and pay.

Many of these events turned violent during this period, including the infamous Haymarket Riot of 1886. Others gave rise to longstanding traditions: On September 5, 1882, 10,000 workers took unpaid time off to march from City Hall to Union Square in New York City, holding the first Labor Day parade in U.S. history.

**Patriot Day in the USA
2025**

September 11

Patriot Day or National Day of Remembrance is observed in the United States on September 11th to honor the victims of the 9/11 attacks in New York, Virginia, and Pennsylvania. The day commemorates nearly 3,000 lives lost, recognizes the bravery of first responders, and encourages national reflection and unity.

How to Get Involved

There are many ways to observe Patriot Day and honor the memory of those affected by the events of September 11, 2001:

- **Participate in Memorial Events:** Participate in a local or national memorial service or event. Communities organize ceremonies, candlelight vigils, and other gatherings to commemorate 9/11.
 - **Observe a Moment of Silence:** At 8:46 AM EDT, pause for a moment of silence to honour those lost and remember the significance of the day.
 - **Volunteer or Donate:** You may choose to volunteer or donate to organizations that assist first responders, veterans, or families impacted by terrorism. Providing service is one approach to recognizing the unity that followed the events.
 - **Fly the Flag at Half-Staff:** The American flag is flown at half-staff on Patriot Day as a sign of respect. You can observe this by lowering your flag at home or work.
- Educate and Reflect:** Consider learning about the events of 9/11 and their subsequent impact. Share information and discuss relevant lessons with others, including those who did not experience the events directly.

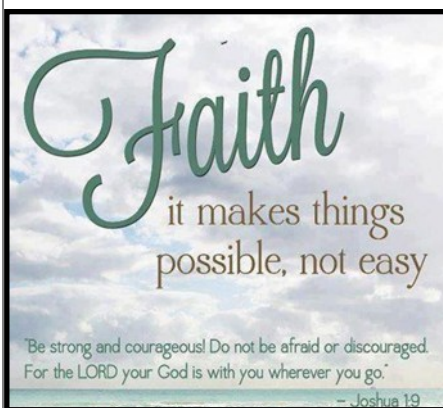

A liturgist assists the pastor in leading worship. They may lead congregational participation such as the Call to Worship and the Opening Prayer. Their role is outlined by the Pastor.

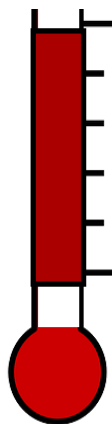

Scripture: Luke 14:1-11

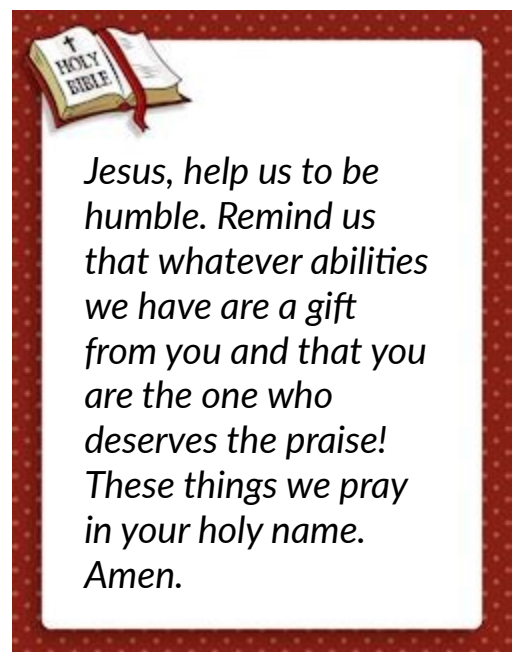

On the other hand, if we are humble, and realize that it is through God's strength that we are able to do great things, we will be given a place of honor in the kingdom of God. (Luke 14:1-11)

From now on, when you see a balloon, I hope it will remind you that we should not become too puffed up with our own importance -- or something may come along and burst our balloon!
