Howell City Park Last year it was discovered the land for the park had never been dedicated to the city. It was a long process, but I'm happy to announce it was finalized in Feburary. So the park and the wooded area to the south are now officially the city's. If you have any questions or concerns about the park you can contact the City of Howell.

BYLAW ENFORCEMENT

Rolling Oaks adheres to bylaws which can be found on the website. These bylaws were established by the developer of the subdivision and are enforced by the Board through a formalized notification and enforcement process which can also be found online. Bylaws prohibit large items like boats and RV's from being stored in driveways or in the street, as well as prohibit fences with the exception of properties that border M-59 or Byron Rd.

Finally, the bylaws require trash and recycling receptacles to be kept out of sight. Receptacles are expected to be brought up from the curb by the next day after trash pickup. Trash and recycling receptacles are also expected to be concealed and close to your house/garage or placed in a more courteous location during the week.
