The safety of the TVQA guild representatives is of utmost concern. Remember, your safety comes first! The following guidelines apply when the National Weather Service issues a severe weather warning:

If the schools in Rutherford County are closed on the day of the quarterly TVQA board meeting due to weather conditions, or if Rutherford County is under a severe weather warning, there will be no in-person TVQA board meeting. A Zoom meeting will be held and attendance at the zoom meeting will go toward the guilds' incentive. All guild presidents will be contacted, and they should share the information with their guild members.

If Board members' schools outside Rutherford County are closed or their weather is severe, they should use their best judgment in deciding whether to attend in-person or on Zoom. The members should notify one of the Executive Board if this occurs.

If you will not be at the TVQA meeting due to severe weather, contact the TVQA President, Vice President or Secretary either the night before the meeting or before 9:00 a.m. the day of the meeting.

She reminded everyone that all TVQA event registrations are now done online thanks to our event coordinator, Judy Allen. Clues will be released after 5pm the 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday of March, April and May, with tops being shown at Assembly Day in July. The pattern is jelly roll friendly and scrap friendly! The guild is also offering to all the chance to attend a bus trip to Shipshewana September 8-12, and shared the information about it. She is also working with the hotel next to Stitchers Garden in Brentwood for a possible summer sewalong weekend in June with members at large as hosts, details TBA.

Sheila reported our current balance is \$13,056.87. She reminded guilds to send in the dues. 
To facilitate delivery of your registration confirmations, please add the following emails to your address book or safe senders in your email program:

# **Meeting Location:**

Members coming from Nashville on I-24 use Exit 66B, cross back over I-24, drive straight for approximately 5 miles, then turn left onto Jefferson Pike.
