SOME HISTORY, KEY WEST AND OUR BUILDING! (THANX TO DAVE ARNOLD)

I was over at OIF one morning and saw Mike Mulligan. He said he goes back to 1972 at 801 Georgia St. The Knights of the Cabaneros had meetings in our building.

I did a google search on Knights of the Cabaneros and came up with this information:

The "Knights of the Cabaneros" in Key West refers to a group of early Cuban cigar workers who, in the late 1860s, fled to Key West to escape violence in their homeland's independence struggle. These refugees, including Knights of the Cabaneros, brought with them their expertise in cigar-making, which became a significant industry in Key West.

Here's a more detailed breakdown:

- Early Cuban Immigration: Since the 1960s, numerous Cubans have emigrated, with many settling in the Keys and Key West.
- **Key West and the Cigar Industry:** The cigar industry in Key West had its origins in the 1830s, with early factories employing many workers.
- The "Knights of the Cabaneros": This term likely refers to a group of cigar workers, possibly with ties to a specific Cuban secret society, who came to Key West seeking refuge.
- Impact on Key West: The influx of Cuban immigrants, including these cigar workers, had a significant impact on Key West's culture, economy, and history.
- **Historical Significance:** Key West's close proximity to Cuba (only 90 miles away) has historically made it a destination for Cuban immigrants seeking a new life.
- This is also a timely reminder of the importance of our immigrant population!!
