

PYC Inter Club Competition 2006

Report from John Waller, PYC Interclub Convener

This year five clubs entered a total of 22 exhibits, but only three clubs had sufficient entries to be eligible for the Interclub Trophy. The participating clubs were: City of Sails Youth Stamp Club, Hamilton Junior Stamp Club, Ashhurst Junior Stamp Club, Hutt Valley Junior Stamp Club, and the Tauranga and District Stamp Club Youth Section. Of the 22 exhibits there were 2 traditional and 20 thematic, continuing the trend of thematic dominance amongst young collectors. The exhibits were displayed and the Interclub Shield presented at the Ambury Shield Interclub Competition Day in Hamilton on the 11th November.

The overall standard of entries was very good, reflecting both the good exhibits being produced at Stamp Camp and the improved standard of club entries overall. The decision to allow entries to be of 4 or 8 pages also seems to have paid dividends, with more better-quality exhibits on display this year.

2006 was a very exciting year for the club. Firstly we were hosts of the PYC 40th Anniversary Yoth Stamp Camp which was held in July at the Motu Moana Scout Camp Complex in Blockhouse Bay, Auckland. Seven of our members attended the camp and their projects were entered in several exhibitions afterwards.

The first one was the North Shore Philatelic Society's Annual Exhibition at Takapuna, where Rachel Andrews won the Youth Grand Award and all the entrants received a prize. The next showing was at the PYC Inter-Club competition held in conjunction with the Ambury Shield in Hamilton. We travelled as a club to Hamilton by minibus, and it was a great occasion as our club was the winning club and received the PYC Interclub trophy, so it was very exciting day. The final showing of the entries was in the Development Class at Kiwipex National Exhibition which was held in Christchurch. All the members received very attractive medals from the Exhibition where Rachel Andrews and Timothy Kemp also each won a special prize for their efforts.

During the year our club was asked to be guest speakers at two senior clubs, the South Auckland Philatelic Society in February and the Wellesley Philatelic Society in September. Both of these clubs have financially supported the City of Sails in recent years so it was good for our members to show what they can do with their collecting.

The final meeting of the year was the Christmas Party and award giving for participation and progress during the year, Eric Chung was awarded the Ryan Shield for the member gaining most points during the year. The Lee Plaque for the best four page exhibit went to Tait Beekmans, and the Gerald & Marion Ellott Cup for the most improved went to Rachel Andrews for the stamp camp project which won much acclaim at the various competitions. The Leaders were much encouraged with the enthusiasm and the standard of collecting shown by all the members and look forward to the coming year.

This is a popular site for Stamp Camps. This camp we will be using the main A frame building. As this is a winter camp, we have plenty of heating in this hall. Bunkrooms are roomy and warm. The dining area and kitchen facilities are modern. The Camp area has plenty of outdoor area for activities. It's an ideal Camp Site for Stamp Collectors.

The Southern Skies Stamp Camp will be a fun filled week of stamp collecting, holiday activities and will include a mystery bus trip. Organisers hope that Campers have a holiday as well as get a great boost to their stamp collecting. There are talks and workshops, special guest speakers and some very good displays as a way of encouraging young collectors to expand their own stamp collecting. Campers will be encouraged and helped to put together a four or eight page project. .Help and advice will be given to those wishing to put entries into Huttpex 2007 in the Development Class. The Camp Staff are mainly PYC members that are long time stamp collectors who have a lot of genuine Stamp Camp experience.

The Camp is open to all youngsters 10 years and over. We can accept younger stamp collecting children if accompanied by a parent or older brother/sister. The cost is \$150 per head for the week long camp. 
