The Eagle Shoot October 19th 2025 Or the Schutzenfest.

This shoot is run like the ones they have in Germany and was put on by Peter tho Seeth, our favorite Captain from Germany. The wooden Eagle was made by Henry Bielinski because he had the winning shot last year. Unfortunately he couldn't attend because of work.

The Eagle is made from flat boards and each part is joined together with glue. The parts are the Apple, Scepter, Left Talon, Right Talon, Left Wing, Right Wing, Crown, Tail, Head, and Body.

All shooters are lined up in the order they signed up and each person takes one shot at the announced Eagle part. It takes a lot of shots to shoot a part off, mostly because we aren't very good shots and because it takes several good hits right along the joint to break it off. We go through the shooting order many, many times before it is all finished.
