

Blast from the Past!

Recently given to Bob McGeever a 1996-97 SCWD Flyer Would you be interested in an afternoon of live demonstrations of modeling techniques plus video and slide shows about prototype railroads? Photo and model contests to look at or enter? Of course, refreshments and door prizes? All followed by a visit to a fellow modeler's home layout for ideas and inspirations.

Then join us at the next meeting of the South Central Wisconsin Division of the National Model Railroad Association. We welcome modelers in ALL gauges and scales - both novices and experts, and you don't have to be a NMRA member to attend the meetings. Your first meeting is free (after that we ask that you kick in a nominal \$1 towards the cost of the room).

Our regular meetings are at the Fitchburg Community Center on Lacy Road off Fish Hatchery south of the Beltline (generally fine first Sunday of the month), from 1 to 4 in the afternoon. If you go on the layout tour you can figure on spending another hour.

In addition to our meetings, we produce a Model Railroad School for beginners in January, a Train Show at the Forum in February, a banquet in May and a picnic in July, with a Swap Meet in October. We have several programs to encourage young people's interest in model railroading and provide 64 of the libraries in our area with books and magazines on model railroading.

The 1996-97 season promises to be the biggest in the more than 25-year history of the SCWD as next July27-August 2 we host the National Convention of the NMRA, co-sponsored by the N-Gaugers and the Wisconsin Garden Railway Society. There'll be a weeklong schedule of clinics, more than 50 home layout tours, plus visits to major railroad attractions and other major tourist sites. Won't you help us?

# Enjoy receiving interesting rail photos, model railroad tips and challenging Mystery Photos??

Join The 75+ SCWD members and members from other Midwest Regional Divisions who are participating in the SCWD listserv. You can expect 4 - 6 photos of railfan photos or model railroad photos per week on average, as well as SCWD announcements, and a monthly Mystery Photo contest. The listserv has been running this since April 2012 (that will be 7 years this coming April), and it has been quite popular.

The listserv is a one-way email broadcast to you, not a social media type service. The emails are sent in bulk, but as a BCC: type email, so no one knows the identity or email addresses of the participants. Once a month, I send out a Mystery Photo, and then if you know the answer or do a little research, you send an email back to <a href="mailto:sewdmemberlist@frontier.com">sewdmemberlist@frontier.com</a>. About a week later, I post the answer and a list of the names of those who sent in answers that month. The answer often includes parts of the best correct answers received.

\*\*Note: If you used to be on the list but stopped receiving this, probably if you changed your email, just send your name and new email address to the email address below \*\*

Please realize that a lot of email client programs treat all BULK emails as SPAM or JUNK. To avoid missing out on things I send, just add <a href="mailto:sewdmemberlist@frontier.com">sewdmemberlist@frontier.com</a> as a contact in your contact list.

I only send photos with credits and club announcements, no political stuff, jokes or other non-rail things. 

#### **SCWD 2019-20 Video Contest Guidelines**

This year's SCWD video contest will be open for submitting entries on November 1, 2019.



- There are two categories: **Prototype** and **Model.**
- The contest is open to those who attend the SCWD meetings.
- The person submitting an entry <u>must</u> be the one who took the video, however you may have help from others in <u>editing</u> your entry.
- The video can be from any time period (it doesn't have to be taken just to enter this contest).
- It has to be a **maximum** of 5 minutes in length, but can be any size less than that and the file has to be <u>less than 2GB in size</u>.
- All videos must be on a railroad theme.
- The video can have title screen but not necessary, however there should be no names or identifiers on it (it is a "blind" contest).
- For the **Model Category**, the video can be of anyone's layout, not just your own.
- First, second and third place will be given for each category (no points given toward annual Photographer contest).
- Deadline for Entries March 1 (you will upload all entries to the website listed on the SCWD website, Video Contest webpage).
- You may enter more than once (max. of 5 entries per person).
- Voting starts Mar 10 on the SCWD Video Contest webpage.
- Voting will be closed on end of day April 15.
- Winners will be announced at the May Meeting.

#### Our website's "Beginner's Guide" gets a new beginning

The Beginners' Guide sits on the public side of the NMRA website and is intended to serve as an introduction to scale model railroading for those thinking of entering our hobby. The current Guide has served us since the beginning of the website and much of it came by scanning existing print material. However, much of the material is now dated and as has been mentioned many times, its structure is "print based" rather than "digital content based." Therefore, the NMRA Board decided that it was time for a "re-do."

Not surprisingly, when the Board, Officers, and Department Managers were discussing this project, eyes turned towards the Education Department. So that's how something got added to my "to-do" list. I asked President Pete Magoun to put out an "all call" for volunteers for this project, and we were delighted to get a good response. So now a committee of eleven members with representation from eight NMRA Regions will tackle the job.

The goal is to produce a Guide that will take a beginner from the purchase of a train set to making a small operating layout. New content, photos, and videos will be incorporated into the Guide. The planned roll-out of the new Beginners' Guide is late 2020.






