WSCO Sponsored Bus Trip to the Welsh Hills

The Welsh Society of Central Ohio sponsored a bus trip tour to the Welsh Hills of Granville on Saturday, June 13, 2015. Nineteen WSCO members and guests enjoyed a trip back in history to learn about the Welsh who settled the Granville area in the early 1800's and the Indian Moundbuilders even earlier.

Leaving from Columbus, our driver **Keith** drove a motor coach east to Granville, Ohio (established in 1805) and the beautiful rolling hills of Licking County

which has been home to many cultures for thousands of years. Our first visit was to the Granville Historical Society and Museum where **Maggie Brooks** and **Janet Philipps Procida** welcomed us. Participants enjoyed a great 20-minute video Janet created explaining how the Welsh settled and thrived in the area. Participants then had an opportunity to view displays ranging from the early pioneer families to more modern 1950s artifacts.

Boarding the bus once again Janet, a descendant of the founding fathers of the Welsh Hills, shared her wealth of information on the area by providing a one-hour guided driving tour. Before heading north, we drove through Granville and viewed the lovely New-England-like community, which showed evidence of Welsh-named homes and streets scattered throughout the village. Continuing north we entered the Welsh Hills (established in 1802), so named for the gently rolling hills and valleys that looked so much like the home country in Wales. Janet pointed out various historic homes and sites throughout the journey with special details provided. Two stops were made, the first being the Welsh Hills Baptist Church, established in 1808, and the Welsh Hills Cemetery, where graves from the early pioneering families were seen.

The bus proceeded to the historic Bryn Du Mansion with its expansive front lawn, once owned by Welshman **John Sutphin Jones**, whose fortune was built on coal mines and railroads. There we met Bryn Du Director **Bruce Cramer** who provided a brief explanation of the house and its infamous owners. Bus participants were able to spend a little extra time and enjoy some lunch and music as the Granville Arts Affair and Wine Festival was going on amongst the mansion grounds.

Beating a brief rain shower the bus continued on into Newark and Heath to the Great Circle Earthworks and Museum which includes an interactive video and 1,000-square-foot exhibit. A detailed historic perspective was provided by tour guide **Tim Jordan.** Due to a bad storm we were unable to walk the grounds, part of a 2,000 year-old set of geometric earthen enclosures built by the Hopewell Indians. The Great Circle Earthworks is owned by the Ohio History Connection (formerly known as the Ohio Historical Society), in cooperation with The Ohio State University-Newark.

This exact bus trip to Granville and the Welsh Hills in Licking County was offered again as a tour to participants attending the North American Festival of Wales on Thursday, September 3.

A huge thank you to WSCO member Maggie Brooks and Janet Philipps Procida for assisting in the planning and implementation of this bus tour!

History of Welsh in Columbus Series: Miami Avenue Presbyterian Church

Previous articles in this series have touched on the trifecta of Welsh churches in Columbus, the Welsh Calvinistic Methodist Church (1849 – 1888), the Welsh Presbyterian Church (1888 – 1919) and the Miami Avenue Presbyterian Church (1919 – 1962). This time I am highlighting the Miami Avenue Presbyterian Church a little more. Many thanks to WSCO member **Myron Cherry**, who found in his archives the final letter written to the Miami Avenue congregation from the Columbus Presbytery the final month before the church closed its doors. The poignant letter provides a nice summarized history of the three churches and its faithful congregation that I am reprinting it here, in its entirety.

As written in a Sunday service bulletin in June 1962:

Prepared by the closing commission of the Columbus Presbytery and delivered at the June 15th (1962) meeting of the Presbytery.

Since the Miami Avenue Presbyterian Church in Columbus, Ohio will hold its final service of worship on June 24, 1962, it seems fitting and proper that due recognition be given to the service rendered and the inspiration provided by this faithful congregation during the 113 years of existence.

Organized as the Welsh Presbyterian Church of the Calvinistic Methodist connection in 1849 when Columbus had a population of 18,000, its membership, over the years, has been largely the second and third generation of Welsh people who came to America and settled in Ohio. Its efforts have been to preserve the worthwhile qualities that characterized the Welsh people, a sturdy hardy folk, with a deep love of liberty, a strong religious fervor, a gift for song and profound interest in education and the poetic arts. In 1850 they built their first church building on the corner of Fifth and Long Streets. The second building was erected at the corner of Sixth and Long Streets and dedicated in 1888. The present building was constructed in 1920 and in 1921 the congregation decided to change its name to Miami Avenue Presbyterian Church. On January 1, 1922, services in the Welsh language were discontinued.

Some highlights of its history include:

- It has always been self-supporting.
- It always operated on a balanced budget and has no debt now.
- In proportion to its membership and resources, it has been liberal in supporting the various benevolent projects of the Presbyterian and United Presbyterian Church.
- In the last 100 years, it has produced many leaders for other churches and there is scarcely a Protestant church in Columbus

that has not benefited from the leadership of a man or woman who received his or her early training at the Miami Avenue Presbyterian Church. An outstanding example is Dr. D. Luther Evans, of the Department of Philosophy at Ohio State University and an Elder in the Overbrook United Presbyterian Church on North High Street.

With the changing times and conditions, recent years have witnessed an exodus of its constituents from the vicinity of Miami Avenue and the congregation reluctantly but courageously voted in the Spring of 1962, to request the Presbytery of Columbus to dissolve it at the end of June, 1962.

Mindful of its long service and regretting the need to concur with this request, the Presbytery of Columbus notes with thanks and appreciation the many and various contributions to the Kingdom of Christ made by the Miami Avenue congregation.

The building used as the Miami Avenue Presbyterian Church still stands today at 116 Miami Avenue. Credit must be given to the Welsh Presbyterian Church members when they decided to move to the Miami Avenue site, for they sold the Long & Sixth Street location before the Miami property was even built. There must have been a great deal of will and faith that the congregation would survive not having a building of their own for almost two years. They were fortunate to have the assistance of many area churches who allowed them to use their buildings for services and meetings, including the Welsh Congregational Church that was located at the corner of Gay and Washington Streets (about where the Columbus Museum of Art parking lot is). The final cost of the building was \$125,000.

The move to the building was indeed successful in 1921 and the congregation continued to thrive. Many groups which started in the former church maintained and often times grew based on what was happening at the time, such as music, Sunday school, the Ladies Aid and Missionary Society, the Miami Friendly Guild, and the Men's Brotherhood. In 1949 the church celebrated its 100-year anniversary by having a reception and writing a historical tribute book. We have found some photographs from this reception, which highlights the Reverend **Frederick Kirker**, who was the pastor at the time. Beginning in 1948 the Welsh Society of Central Ohio also used the building to hold their Board meetings.

With the assistance of several of you we have found archived documentation from the three churches, but especially the Miami Avenue Church, to further preserve the history of the Welsh in Columbus.

The history of Columbus display that was created for the North American Festival of Wales will be shown at the WSCO Gymanfa Ganu in October, along with some of the pictures and documents that have been located.
