We had the opportunity to participate in professional development sessions on Friday, October 7th. We met and had breakout sessions and collaborated with instructors and teaching staff who work in our diocese. Recently the middle-school staff and I worked to develop an SST/Impact team consisting of Mrs. Avila, Mr. Pereira, and myself.
