# BHPCNS will not be raising tuition rates for the 2019-2020 school year.

2019-2020 acceptance letters were sent home in mid- January. If you did not receive your child's acceptance letter stop by the office for a copy. We are almost fully enrolled for the 2019-2020 school year. Thank you. If you have friends who are looking for next year, ask them to contact the office ASAP to tour and apply. If you have questions regarding your child's placement, contact the office. To confirm your child's space, deposits are due February 15<sup>th</sup>.

Parent/Teacher conferences will be held throughout February. Conferences are a time for the teachers to share their observations of your child in a school setting. It's a time to for you to share your child's accomplishments and challenges with us. BHPCNS is here to support your child's growth each and every day. 


We have a busy few weeks coming up at BHPCNS. We're just one month out from our Winter Gala! Get your tickets, purchase sponsorships, and see more information at



Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled throughout February. Here's some tips to get the most out of the conference experience.



It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending for next fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September, the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall.

# SPRING BREAK APRIL 13<sup>TH</sup> THROUGH APRIL 22<sup>ND</sup>





# STAY AND PLAY UPDATES



Monday: The Artist's Corner By Mrs. McCullough ART - LOVE is in the air and in Art Stay & Play. A 3-D heart mobile will be created by cutting, painting and finally gluing. We'll finish up the month and the topic of Impressionism by printing a family portrait influenced by Mary Cassett.


Explorer Senarathne Shares:

Little Hands Music 2s, 3s, & 4s

#### Ms. Beth Reports:


Winter weather is REALLY here and music classes are singing, telling stories, playing instruments, and dancing all about it! Whether Or Not poem (Track #19) and Rocky Mountain song (Track #1) are the soon-to-be favorites for February!

#### Whether it's cold, or whether it's hot We shall have weather, whether or not!

You can hear/download them here, along with other music from "Weather or Not" album to enjoy at home or in the car! Our movement experiences have followed the concepts of high and low (mirroring the lyrics of Rocky Mountain,) as well as echoing rhythm patterns in the Whether or Not poem, and a fun movement story about a Fairy Snow Princess inviting Snow Men, Prancing Horses, and Squirrel-y-Steps to her party - following the rhythm of the words with our feet! Coming up in March - Wind and bird songs and activities. Stay tuned!

#### Scientist Delfin Reports:

This month in science we will learn about bones and how they make up our skeleton. We will identify the major bones in our body and their functions, look at X-rays and piece together a full picture of a skeleton and learn how to keep our bones healthy. We will use our bones for skeleton yoga and, because it is the month of Valentine's Day, we will end with an examination of how our hearts work and the bones that protect it.



Science Class 3s & 4s



#### Mrs. Stevens Reports:

This month in Creative Movement, I will introduce the parachute for the first time this school year. Most gross motor skills develop muscles in the lower body. However, the parachute strengthens muscles in the shoulder, arm and hand muscles. Parachute play, besides being lots of fun, encourages teamwork while focusing on rhythm and listening skills. Also, the children will swirl, twirl, spin, and gallop to the song *Snowflakes Coming Down*!

#### Ms. Casey Sings:

What a wonderful time of year! The snowy weather has brought our songs about winter to life. For the two year-olds – and many of the three year-olds – this is their first memorable experience with snow! The twos classes have finally become comfortable with music and enthusiastically embrace our dance parties. This month we introduced our new January two's class (our tiniest people) to the music program and their response was priceless! The three's classes have the biggest learning curve at this point as they are being exposed to lots of new music. The four's classes are starting to learn more complex songs with varying verses. In the coming months, our big kids will learn the structures of songs and that everyone can be a songwriter! I am reminded daily of how fortunate I am to work with your children through music. Thank you for sharing them with us!



Music Ms. Casey 2s, 3s, & 4s



#### Sra. Cardoni Shares:

In Spanish we finished up our lesson on our body (cuerpo). We have learned Spanish words for our body parts and can sing Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes in Spanish (Cabeza, Hombros, Piernas, Pies) and dance the Hokey Pokey! We read <u>De la Cabeza a los Pies (From Head to Feet)</u> the Eric Carle book translated into Spanish. In the 4s Classes, the children are learning to speak in complete sentences answering questions about how many arms/fingers/eyes/etc. they have, their names and how olds they are. In February we will be learning about feelings (sentimentos). The children will be singing <u>If You're Happy and You Know It</u> in Spanish but changing the words a bit to sing if you're happy (feliz)-clap (aplaude), if you're mad (enojado)-stomp (marcha), if you're sad (triste)-cry (llora) and if you're silly (tonto)-shout (grita). We will be reading <u>Asi Me Siento</u> <u>Yo (The Way that I Feel)</u> by Janan Cain, a lovely rhyming book about feelings and <u>Como</u> <u>Dicen "Estoy Enojado" Los Dinosaurios? How Do Dinosaurs Say "I'm Mad"</u> by Jane Yolen. We continue to review all of the words we've learned and are amassing quite a vocabulary!
