KEEPING COOL DURING THE DOG DAYS OF SUMMER

Dogs tend to enjoy sitting in the sun but lots of time spent in the sun can cause heat stroke and increase the risk of skin cancers. Please be sure to provide a shady area for your dog to relax in. Also, to help your dog cool off, you can use a kiddie pool! Put just a couple of inches of water in it and place it in a shady location, and while you're at it you can dip your tootsies in it too! For a cool treat try adding a few ice cubes to your pet's water bowl. They will enjoy it and it will keep their body temperature down. During the hottest days, consider exercising your pets only in the early mornings or late evenings to avoid the hottest parts of the day. If you have ever stepped onto concrete or pavement on hot days barefoot, you quickly realize you need a layer of protection and so do our pets. For the summer try keeping your dogs on the grass or for long walks invest in a pair of booties to keep their pads from burning.

SIGNS OF DANGER – Keep an eye on your pets during particularly hot days and watch for indications that they are having difficulty with the heat. Signs of distress due to heat include vomiting or drooling, fatigue, heavy panting or difficulty breathing, diarrhea or seizures.
