Phacelia

Balo phacelia, also known as lacy phacelia, performs best as a spring annual and is known for its very shallow root structure that has the ability to finely aggregate the top few inches of soil. It is a herbaceous, non-leguminous, flowering annual foliage that grows to approximately 2 feet tall. **Balo phacelia** plants appear ferny and produce beautiful flowers that are various shades of purple or white that attract a large array of beneficial and pollinator insects species. **Balo phacelia** is quick to grow and flower and is an excellent choice both in cover crop mixtures as well as a bee forage, especially in vineyards.

APPLICATIONS

- Use in cover crop mixtures to finely aggregate the top few inches of soil
- Use as an attractant for beneficial insects
- Use as an attractant to bees in vineyards

- Very drought tolerant
- Shallow very dense root structure

MANAGEMENT

- Planting Rate: 3 - 5 pounds per acre
- Planting Depth: 1/4 inch
- Optimum Mix Percentage: 30 - 40%
- Winterkills at approximately 18 degrees F

- Maintain growth and root production even during drought
- Finely aggregates soil
- Excellent for anywhere honeybees are needed
