- 3. The Cake and any Fillings and Frostings must be made **from scratch with edible ingredients**. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.) Any decorations must just be edible.
- 4. The recipe shall include eggs that were produced in Pennsylvania, if possible.
- 5. The entire cake entry must be submitted for judging on cardboard or other food safe disposable setting. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
- 6. Recipe(s) listing the ingredients and the preparation instructions must be submitted with the entry (printed on one-side of 8-1/2" x 11" size sheets of paper). Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back of all the pages. (All recipes and cakes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
- 7. Refrigeration is NOT available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned, or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
- 8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

Flavor (smell, taste, flavoring)	30 points
Inside Characteristics (texture and lightness)	25 points
Overall Appearance (surface, size, color)	20 points

# 37th Annual Blue Ribbon Apple Pie Contest Rules

- 1. Open to any individual **amateur** baker who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
- 2. Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest any other fair in 2025.
- 3. The Apple Pie, including fillings and crust, must be made **from scratch with edible ingredients.** No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.) Any decorations must just be edible.
- 4. Recipe **must include at least 60% apples in the filling.** It does not need to be a "traditional" two crusted apple pie and it can have a variety of fillings.
- 5. The entire pie must be submitted for judging in a food safe disposable pie pan. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
- 6. The recipe for the pie and pie crust must be submitted with the entry. It should be submitted on one side of 8 ½" by 11" sheets of paper. The recipe must list all the ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the <u>back side</u> of all the pages. (All recipes and pies will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
- 7. Refrigeration <u>is not</u> available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned, or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
- 8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

Flavor	30 points
Filling: consistency, doneness, moistness & flavor	25 points
Crust: color, flavor, texture doneness	20 points
Overall Appearance	15 points
Creativity	10 points
TOTAL	100 points

- 7. The entire cake entry must be submitted for judging on cardboard or other food safe disposable setting. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
- 8. Recipes must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8 ½" x 11" sheets of paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (All recipes and cakes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
- 9. Refrigeration is <u>not</u> available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned, or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

Canned foods to be judged on quality, general appearance and container. Use standard mason-type, clear quart/pint jars for preserving and exhibiting fruits, vegetables and meats. Use two-piece self-sealing lids (flat discs and metal screw bands) for sealing all jars of food. Metal screw bands may be loosely applied while transporting jars to and from the Fair to prevent damage; however, screw bands must be removed from jars before exhibiting entries. All food not in standard jars or not sealed with selfsealing lids will be disqualified by the judge.
