Frank Weldon - Wood Craftsman



Mr. Weldon has been a long-time member of St.
Paul AME. Though retired, he remains busy! One of his current projects is the restoration of the St. Paul pulpit chairs. While serving as a

Trustee, Mr. Weldon was asked to move some of the Pulpit chairs due to damage and



tear. After seeing that all the chairs needed care, Mr. Weldon decided to volunteer his talents in restoring them all, in as much as possible, to their former luster and strength. "I


believe I was led to do what I'm doing. I love the history, making connection with our past through things that were done for a reason."

The maker(s) of the chairs and time of manufacture are unknown. "I gather they were probably made around the turn of the twentieth century, based on some of the techniques noted in their construction and the fact that they appear to have been involved in the fire that occurred at St. Paul [in 1909]." Mr. Weldon determined this from the appearance of charring on the wood frames of the chairs.



Weldon learned carpentry beginning in high school and has always pursued his love of the craft. When asked whether carpentry remains meaningful in today's mass production economy, he replied, "Yes! Carpentry is the poetry of craftsmanship. It has 'soul', use, and function." When you see his work in restoring the beautiful "nautilus" design of the arm and other features of the St. Paul pulpit chairs, you appreciate exactly what he means! The restoration has not been a solo endeavor and Frank Weldon extends special thanks to fellow St. Paul member. Harry Thompson, who has contributed his talents in wood refinishing to the project.

Featured Recipe from Heavenly Delights by St. Paul AME Church, Raleigh NC





Divans pg. 47
This is a great recipe for after Thanksgiving turkey!

- 6 slices turkey or 2 cups cut-up turkey.
- 2 (10 oz.) pkgs. Frozen broccoli spears, cooked and drained
- 6 slices American or cheddar cheese (about 6 oz.)
- 1 (13 ½) can evaporated milk
- 1 (10 ½ oz.) can cream of mushroom soup, condensed
- 1 (3 ½ oz) can French-fried onion rings

Heat oven to 350°. Arrange turkey in ungreased baking dish (11 ½ x 7 ½ x 1 ½). Top with hot broccoli; cover with cheese. Stir together milk and soup, pour over cheese. Bake uncovered for 25 minutes. Sprinkle with onion rings and bake 5 minutes longer. Makes 4 to 6 servings. Enjoy!
