BLESSED ANGELA SALAWA Day of Remembrance March 12

Blessed Angela Salawa was a maid for many years, eventually becoming a Secular Franciscan who worked with wounded and sick soldiers during World War I. Amidst

her work at this time during the devastation of the war she wrote in her diary, "I want you [Christ] to be adored as much as you are destroyed." While in Kraków she became caught up in worldly pursuits and her religious fervor waned. Her sister Teresa appealed to Angela to reconsider her worldly values. While dancing at a wedding reception, Angela perceived Christ standing nearby, asking her how she could prefer dancing to following Him. The experience was a turning-point in her life. She rekindled her faith and became devoted to adoring Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. She was extraordinarily responsive to the actions of the Holy Spirit". When World War I broke out in 1914, Angela remained in Kraków, nursing soldiers. Her own health was deteriorating, but no one noticed her suffering. In 1916 she lost her employment, she was homeless, in pain and ill. Eventually she was alone in the world, living in a basement room, abandoned by family, friends and neighbors. Blessed Angela teaches us that humility should never be mistaken for lack of conviction, insight or energy. Angela brought the Good News and material assistance to some of Christ's "least ones." Her self-sacrifice inspired others to do the same.


SOUP-INS
