


## Lawrence Edward Degg

(September 20, 1940 - January 5, 2015)

Lawrence "Larry" Degg, 74, of Caseville died Monday, January 5, 2015 at Covenant Hospital in Saginaw.

Larry was born September 20, 1940 in Bay City to the late Lawrence and Edwinna (Theobald) Degg. He graduated from St. James High School in Ferndale in 1958. He married Mary Barbara Cooke on March 24, 1979 in Fraser.

Larry worked at GM in Warren, retiring from Chevrolet/EDS in 1996. After retiring he moved to Caseville.
