

On 9/19/97, this Officer interviewed [REDACTED].

Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he was in Boy Scouts and [REDACTED] taught the Cub Scouts. [REDACTED] stated he started when he was young and under the age of ten years old. He stated he was in troop # 338 and that Jack Walls was his scout leader. [REDACTED] stated he didn't believe it when Jack got in trouble the last time. He stated that he still has Philmount pictures and backpacks of his house. He stated that Jack brought alcohol and pornographic material to their campouts. He stated that him and [REDACTED] were best friends. He stated that they would get liquor from Jack. He stated that he had a birthday party when he was in the seventh grade and Jack gave liquor to his brother, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. He stated that they had it at his party and his parents found out about it. He stated that [REDACTED] mother, [REDACTED] was very upset and tried to get Jack kicked out of the scouts.

Mr. [REDACTED] said he didn't remember when it was, but on one campout at Quachita Refuge and it was raining. He stated that it was just Jack Walls, [REDACTED] and him at this campout. He stated that they decided to leave and their truck got stuck. He stated that Jack brought out some type of liquor in a coke bottle. He stated that Jack gave it to him and [REDACTED]. He stated that they were sitting in the truck, just waiting and he got drunk. He stated that all he could remember is waking up the next morning at his grandmother's house [REDACTED] in Lonoke. He stated that all he had on was a pair of underwear and he was in a sleeping bag. He stated that he woke up his [REDACTED] and went on in the house. He stated that he called [REDACTED] afterward so she would bring him some clothes. He stated that all his equipment and clothes were left back at the campout. He stated that he thought he went and picked up his stuff, later that day.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated that it was not uncommon for him to get drunk and pass out at campouts and it happened a lot when Jack was there.
