SAABE Accomplishments

Almost a year and a half has gone by since I swore in as your president, and I have to say, it has been my pleasure. However, it is important to me that some things get accomplished if and when I am replaced. First, let's not forget about your fearless board members. Ideas are just ideas unless you have guys and girls like the ones representing you on this board. I would like to list some of our accomplishments compared to the year before, good and bad.

Good: We have changed the way we allow sponsorships which has generated more \$\$ for SAABE.

Bad: We need more full-length educational sponsors.

Good: We ended the year with nearly \$12,000 in the bank and made \$6,600 in net income in 2003. This financial success allows us to work on new programs to benefit members and to promote the building engineer trade.

Good: We increased member participation in board meetings.


Good: We successfully moved to a new meeting location.

Good: We completed a successful membership drive.

Bad: We had fewer members than in 2002.

Good: We set a record for luncheon attendance—100 people in February.



Good: We sponsored workdays and fundraising for Habitat for Humanity and made donations to "Construct a Kids Christmas."

Bad: We need more donations.

Good: We donated a \$1,000 scholarship to the Judson school district to help a young man or woman get started in our trade.

Bad: We need more topical writers for our newsletter.

Good: We began the process of incorporating SAABE.

Good: We started an official liaison relationship with SABOMA to create a closer working relationship.

Great: In 2003, we completely revamped the CBE program so board members to come will have a foundation in which to continue and grow. We also awarded four new CBE certificates in November and two in February 2004.

Real Bad: We mourned the passing of some of our dear colleagues.

Things to Work On:

- Reaching a record 200 members in 2004 (we closed 2003 with 161 members)
 - Increased participation from CPS and SAWS
- Establishing SAABE as a non-profit corporation and a tax-exempt organization



Financial Unplanning (Part 2 of 3)

Budgets

Contrary to belief, budgets do work. Take your expenses over the month, and lay them out on a calendar according to their date due. Take your pay periods, and indicate them as well. Next, come up with a plan. Balancing is also an added treat to a budget. When you can, stagger the date your bulk payments are due. For instance, if you have a home and a vehicle payment, try to arrange so that the payments are not in the same pay period so you do not need to make both payments from one paycheck and have to starve until the next payday. This will even out any binges as well. Just because you got paid today does not mean you have to spend it all by tomorrow!

Timing also has a lot to do with budgets and can also provide some extra cash twice a year depending on pay schedules. If your pay schedule is every two weeks, there are two times a year that you will receive three paychecks in one month. This scenario may bring some added relief. First, if your insurance deductions are based upon 12-months or 24 installments, the latter check will not have the insurance amount deducted, thus, a little extra money. However, this does not work if your yearly amount is calculated over 52weeks, or 26 pay periods. Secondly, if you have worked your budget and regularly make each payment every 4 weeks as opposed to when the note is due each month, you will soon increase the amount of time between the pay period and the time the note is due, allowing you get ahead of your payment schedule. If you keep working your budget, you will find that you will soon have enough time that you can actually postpone a note payment until the next pay period without becoming delinquent!

Balancing the Budget
