

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<u>Dryer Vent Cleaning – Condo owner responsibility!</u>



The dryer ductwork in our Condos run from the dryer itself to the <u>outdoor wall of the building</u>, <u>20 or so feet!</u> This is a fairly long run and best practices would require access to BOTH the outside vent and inside of the individual unit for thorough regular cleaning. *Lint in dryer ducts can cause fires, so this is first and foremost a safety issue*. However, there are other reasons to clean your dryer ductwork:

- Decrease utility bills Even if you clean your lint filter EVERY TIME you use it, lint buildup will, over time, slow down your dryer and dump hot moist air indoors. This can significantly increase your utility bills.
- Less wear and tear on your clothes lack of airflow will make it take longer to dry clothes and will heat the clothes more



COYOTES - have been seen at night around Cambridge Lakes. Be careful. They are likely preying on small rodents and geese.

Perimeter Fence
