MadCity Train Show Volunteers

As you read this we are fast approaching the train show for 2022. We are in a fairly unique situation since we did not have the train show in 2021 due to all the uncertainty and restrictions surrounding the current pandemic. A lot of those uncertainties have followed us into the planning for the 2022 show. The most notable effect was the late decision to go ahead with the show, which put us rather far behind our desired timetable to get things organized. I recently found a message from Paul Mangan back in 2018 or 2019 when he was actually scheduling volunteers starting in September before the next show. That obviously didn't happen this year.

That said, I am trying to get all the volunteer time slots filled now, recognizing that not everyone is able to help out in ways they may have done in the past. Everyone has been very helpful and forthcoming in helping this happen. The bad news is how short the time frame became, but there is really good news, too. We will have a fair number of new volunteers who have not worked our train show before.

Please know we are doing what we can to ensure the safety of all our volunteers as best we can to mitigate the exposure risks during the show.

1. We ask all our volunteers to mask up during the show.
2. Hand sanitizer will be available in the ticket both and at the information desk.
3. Shields will be placed on the ticket booth windows to reduce exposure.
4. A shield will be placed on the information booth
5. There may be other areas with shields as planning continues.

Dane County does NOT require proof of vaccination for activities in the Alliant Center. There are requirements in other county buildings on the grounds, but not in the Alliant Center.

We are looking forward to having a good show this year, and it is only possible because of the work of all of you, our volunteers.

SCWD 2021-22 Video Contest Guidelines

This year's SCWD video contest will be open for submitting entries on November 1, 2021.

Here are the things you need to know:

- There are two categories: **Prototype** and **Model**.
- The contest is open to those who attend the SCWD meetings.
- The person submitting an entry must be the one who took the video, however you may have help from others in editing your entry.
- The video can be from any time period (it doesn't have to be taken just to enter this contest).
- It has to be a **maximum** of 5 minutes in length, but can be any size less than that and the file has to be less than 2GB in size.
- All videos must be on a railroad or model railroad theme.
- The video can have title screen but not necessary, however there should be no names or identifiers on it (it is a "blind" contest).
- For the **Model Category**, the video can be of anyone's layout, not just your own.
- First, second and third place will be given for each category (no points given toward annual Photographer contest).
- **Deadline for Entries – March 1** (you will upload all entries to the website listed on the SCWD website, Video Contest webpage).
- You may enter more than once (max. of 5 entries per person).
- Voting starts **Mar 10** on the SCWD Video Contest webpage.
- Voting will be closed on end of day **April 15**.
- Winners will be announced at the May 2022 Meeting.


A Word about Constant Contact e-mail

NMRA President's Message

Traditionally your Board of Directors has met in person twice a year and all business has had to wait for those meetings in February or summer before being concluded or moved forward. Always having the directors on the extra board, and with online meetings now being the norm for conducting business, I took the opportunity to call an additional Board of Directors meeting in December 2021. This allowed business to continue rather than stalling for nearly three months. What follows is a summary of the meeting. The full minutes will be posted on the NMRA website and you can read more in the NMRA Presidents Car in the February NMRA Magazine.

For many years we have provided certificates to recognize those who have been NMRA members for 25 and 50 years. The Board of Directors has expanded this program so that US and Worldwide members will now be recognized with a certificate for reaching 2, 5 and 10 years of membership in addition to the current 25 and 50 years.

Every two years the Board is asked to review the dues charged to US members. Any increase is tied to the consumer price index (CPI-E). Therefore, the dues will increase from \$50/year to \$54/year for US members starting April 1st 2022.

The audit of the financial accounts for 2020 was accepted by the Board. The NMRA IRS Return form 990 for 2020 has been posted onto the NMRA website and the Auditor's Report has been added to the members' only section.

The NMRA Digital Publications project team asked that the Board adopt a digital NMRA Magazine as part of the standard membership benefits. The current print magazine will continue. This was accepted by the Board and therefore the NMRA will provide a Digital NMRA Magazine to all members from April 2022. The team will provide more information so I won't say more here other than to thank all of those who have led this project and the members who have provided such valuable input and feedback.

The next 12 months offer us a great opportunity to expand and grow our organization for the future. Digital publishing is now well on the way, an NMRA App will be available, and work is about to start on a major education delivery project. The future is certainly looking more promising than it did 20 months ago. Thank you for all of your efforts in 2021. It is now time to once again set your goals for the New Year and look for new opportunities. I hope that in doing so you are all richly rewarded for your efforts and achievements in the coming year.

It's never too late to dump that gym membership idea and think about spending that time you won't be spending in the gym by volunteering with the NMRA either locally or nationally. We are all the NMRA and the NMRA is only going to be as good as all of us when we work together.

A Puzzle for You

You like trains, or train watching, but have you ever wanted to go to an OPS (Operating Session) and run trains on someone else's layout, but were afraid you wouldn't know what to do?



Model Railroad Operation is a fun and interesting role-playing game where the players (operators) use model trains to simulate the movements of the prototype railroad. Operators fill the roles of railroad employees like engineers, conductors, yardmasters, dispatchers, and more. Many of our SCWD members participate each month at multiple layouts to enjoy this fun and stimulating practice of critical thinking and problem solving in the context of railroad operations.

Now, there is a way for you to get your feet wet in this critical thinking and problem-solving railroad environment in the privacy of your own home through the use of railroad switching puzzles.

In July 2020, a group of SCWD members started a project to introduce more of our members to the enjoyment of railroad operations, or as our wives call it, playing trains. Some of us have been engaged in operating sessions for 20 years or more, and would like to get more of you involved.

The project involves getting one to solve a series of train switching puzzles (on paper, or your computer) in the least number of moves possible. You can then submit your solution to see if yours was done in the least number of moves.

Beginners can start with **3 introductory puzzles** to show the kinds of skills used in railroad switching operations. Then, you can advance to a series of more advanced puzzles written and based on actual SCWD member area layouts. Or, if you have already been to an OPS session, you could do an introductory puzzle, and jump right into the more challenging ones.






