Dear St. Mark's Lutheran,

What a beautiful day we had today! Yes, it was cold, but the sun was shining brightly, the birds were singing, and the scent of spring was in the air. There was a peacefulness in the world around us, a quiet goodness. I don't know about you, but I find myself in need of that peace—quiet, calm, and stillness. Lately, I've been worrying, praying, and thinking about—family, friends, the people I met on my Holy Land trip, both sides of the ongoing conflict there, the people of Ukraine, and so many facing illness and cancer. And maybe you feel this way too; it's hard to watch the news. So, today, with such beautiful weather, I felt called to step away from the office and simply enjoy the peace that God has graciously given us.

This time of year—when winter begins to melt away and spring starts to awaken—always fills me with a deep sense of awe and joy. Part of what makes spring so exciting is that I get to look again at the Easter story, a story that brings renewal and hope, both for the world and for us as individuals in the Church.

This year, as we journey through Luke, a passage from **Luke 23:12** stood out to me again: "That same day Herod and Pilate became friends with each other; before this they had been enemies." In the midst of the Passion narrative, right before Pilate's trial of Jesus before the crowds, Luke shares this brief but striking insight into the relationship between Pilate and Herod. It made me reflect: If these two men, once enemies, could find a way to reconcile, what might God be able to do in our own lives?

There will certainly be times when we face disagreements, and relationships may become strained. But the same God who reconciled the world to Himself through Christ can also transform our hearts and heal our broken relationships. Healing isn't easy—it takes effort, patience, and humility from all parties. But Christ calls us to try, to reach out to one another in love and peace, just as He commanded in **Ephesians 4:32**: "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." It's a high calling, but one we don't face alone. As **Isaiah 43:19** reminds us, "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." God is always at work in ways we cannot yet see, creating new possibilities for healing and renewal.

As we approach Easter and celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, I pray that we, too, may experience reconciliation and peace. Christ's sacrifice on the cross brought us forgiveness, and I hope this Easter that God will work through us to share that forgiveness and hope with everyone we encounter—family, friends, and strangers alike.

May peace and blessings fill your hearts this Easter season,
