

Further Description of Important Features (Continue on reverse if necessary) This modified hall-and-parlor plan features a central brick chimney and an enclosed entrance bay with a dropped shed roof. Like the other company houses in this cluster, windows are built to a reduced scale. This building retains its original 6/6 windows with single-sash, 6-light, awning windows in the entrance bay. 17. History and Significance In the 1920's this typical quarry worker's house was occupied by an Italian family by the name of Fittilini. Mr. Fittilini worked as a laborer for the KIL&T Co., but in addition made and mended boots and shoes in a small work shop in this home. The vicinity of the house is not landscaped.
