ORDINANCE NO. 420

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ST. LAWRENCE, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, PROHIBITING PARKING ALONG NORTH PROSPECT STREET FROM ST. LAWRENCE AVENUE TO THE BOROUGH BOUNDARY LINE; AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH TO PLACE SIGNS ALONG SAID STREET INDICATING THE ABOVE-REFERENCED PARKING RESTRICTION; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS THEREOF

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of St. Lawrence is authorized pursuant to the Borough Code to enact ordinances to protect public health, safety, and welfare;

WHEREAS, vehicles parking along North Prospect Street, a street in the Borough under the jurisdiction of Borough Council, would, in the judgment of Borough Council, limit visibility and would be detrimental to the safety of the traveling public;

WHEREAS, in order to protect the traveling public and pedestrians from the above-described danger, it has been recommended that parking of vehicles be prohibited on the both sides of North Prospect Street as set forth herein.

WHEREAS, under the Borough Code, a municipality is authorized to regulate parking on its streets.

IT IS THEREFORE ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of St. Lawrence, Berks County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the authority of the same as follows:

Section 1. Parking along North Prospect Street, between its intersection with St. Lawrence Avenue (SR0562) and the Borough boundary line shall be prohibited on both sides of North Prospect Street.

Section 2. The Borough Council is authorized to place signs of the form and type approved and authorized by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PADoT), in the manner required under PADoT regulations, setting forth the aforementioned parking restriction.

Section 3. Any person who shall park a vehicle in violation of the restrictions established by this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof by a Magisterial District Judge in a prosecution for a summary offense, be sentenced to pay a fine which shall not be less than Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00) nor more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), and the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment thereof, shall be imprisoned to the extent allowed by law for summary offenses.


Section 4. If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Borough Council of the Borough of St. Lawrence that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.


Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with this Ordinance.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall become effective on the earliest date permitted by law.


