Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

- *Ezekiel 47:1–2, 8–9, 12 Water flows through the temple.*
- *Psalms 46 “The waters of the river gladden the city of God, the holy dwelling of the Most High!”*
- *1 Corinthians 3:9c–11, We are God’s building. 16–17*
- *John 2:13–22 Jesus will raise the temple in three days.*

In his vision of a restored temple in Jerusalem, the holy city—the city of God—Ezekiel sees the life-giving waters that flow from it, bringing life to land and sea. We sing of these waters in the psalm, linking them to God’s dwelling. In the Gospel, Jesus refers to his Body as a temple and in the second reading Paul asserts that we are the temple of God, for the Holy Spirit dwells in each of us. Aware of our holiness and each other’s holiness, we listen together to God’s word.

Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Did you know there are churches in Rome older than St. Peter's? St. John Lateran is one of four major basilicas in the Eternal City, and it is by far the oldest. The land was donated by an ancient Roman family to the Emperor Constantine, who in turn gave it to the Church. For hundreds of years, St. John Lateran was the "mother church." Popes lived on the grounds through the 14th century. The church itself suffered from pillaging by invaders, fires, and earthquakes. It has been restored and rebuilt five times since the 300s. On this feast, we remember more than a building. We celebrate the resiliency of our faith. Though trials may come in our parishes, personal lives, and the world, the Church endures through the grace of Jesus Christ.

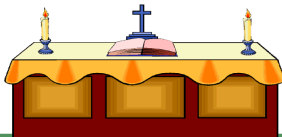
