According to the 2018 Global Slavery Index, the number exceeds 40 million slaves worldwide. Sex trafficking and forced labor oppresses men, women, girls and boy in dozens of industries all over the world.

And the startling fact is that it's happening in your own backyard. In a recent study conducted by the Southern California WaymakersOC Victims Service Agency and The Salvation Army, of the 300+ trafficked victims assisted over a 2-year period, 27% were minors and over 80% were U.S. nationals. Added to this, on-line sexual exploitation is on the rise across the globe.
