
JARED SUAREZ, Bio Highlights

Jared Suarez, raised a musician and singer, to Basque, Italian, Spanish, and Puerto Rican Indo- and Afro-Caribbean influence. Born in NYC, his family emigrated through Ellis Island, and settled in Tampa, FL, and then Naples, FL. His uncle, and mother, served as primary influences, offering an upbringing that emphasized the arts, religion and education.

His uncle, who he took to as role model, was an elected district leader, a civil rights activist, and a board member of the New York City Housing Authority. Through political activism, his daughters were the first Hispanics to be integrated to the Chapin School.

His mother, a primary ESL teacher, early on suffered a tragedy, which consequently caused both parents to become absent from the optimistic and creative family culture they had inspired.

With his mother's health a preoccupation, Jared forewent neighborhood play to keep by her side. A "famous patient" in the small resort town, with a rare diagnosis, Jared focused on the medical arts as a career choice. But with the loss of his mother, and later college friendships, his pursuits shifted to the narrative arts.

Early projects included single camera documentary film production, and media design for small business in his home town community. During this time he travelled and focused on developing his voice as a writer.

His I.P. and titles address current technologically requirements for media design, while maximizing the possibility of bringing forward the best user content, as captured by the "Rated-S" and "Reality TV 2.0" content design and programming models, respectively.
