Regular Meeting ----- January 10, 1991

The meeting was called to order by the Vice- ATTENDANCE
Chairman, Gary Wilson, at 7:00 A.M. at the District office.
Other Board members present were James Walker, John Groo,
Dave Maki, Bobbie Domenick and Karl Tangren.

Special Service District members present were Gary
Wilson, Bill McDougald, George White and Dan Holyoak.

Others present were Dale Pierson and Roberta High-
land.

After calling for additions or corrections to the MINUTES
minutes of the meeting of December 6, 1990, and hearing
none, the Chair declared the minutes approved as circulated
to the Board.

Dale reported the Cemetery well had been acidized CEMETERY WELL
a year ago, and still did not produce more than 150 gpm. REPAIRS
That well had historically been rated for 450 gpm, and the
Board needs to decide whether to try to develop water or to
scale down the pump. The pump is oversized for the amount
of water being produced. Bill McDougald had suggested
mineralization might have taken place in the rock surround-
ing the well, or it could have sanded up. Gary had talked
with Horace Beeman, who had suggested to pull the pump and
put a piece of pipe down to see if the well has sanded back
in to the level of the turbine. If that is so, Beeman feels
the well is gone. After a discussion of possible conditions
and the history of the well and other wells in the area, it
was suggested by Bill McDougald the well be re-drilled. The
Board agreed by consensus to have Horace check for re-
sanding, and to have Dale ask him for an estimate for drill-
ing a new well near the site.

Other Board members were asked if they had any WATER PROSPECTS
other items. Dan asked about water prospects. Dale stated
just before the last storm we were 67% of normal, and if all
stays at the same rate of moisture as 1948, there should be
about 90% of normal available for the irrigation season.
There is about 100 AF more water in the lake than at the
same time last year.

Pumping charges were discussed and Dan asked about DALTON USE
Neal Dalton's over use. Dan asked if there is going to be a
need to pump water this year, and if so, are the pumping
charges going to be on the same basis. Dale pointed out it
is a Board decision to pump additional water and these deci-
sions can be changed each season. Whether or not customers
will opt to pump their own water rather than purchasing

water was discussed.

Gary asked about the Environmental Impact Study on EIS STUDY
Mill Creek. Dale brought out his copy for examination.

Walker asked when the pumping of wells had started PUMPING TO MIC
to MIC. Dale consulted his records and stated Shoemaker
Well had been pumped in April. Walker questioned the
readings, as MIC records did not agree with Piersons' and
Byrnes'. It was suggested Pierson, Byrnes and Turnedge meet
and compare their figures.


Dale reported he had talked to Armstrong Consult- SVW&SID CULI-
ants on Tuesday, and found that Bedke's plan did not serve NARY WATER LINE
all the area necessary for fire prevention. Adding this ad-
ditional line will cause the main be up-sized and will
cause additional costs.


Gary asked about the butterfly valves, and Dale VALVES ON IRRI-
reported that those valves will have to be replaced. He GATION LINE
reported he has talked to Plumbers Supply, and they are
going to give us the valves at their cost. The question was
asked if a gate valve could be substituted. The answer was
no.
