DID YOU KNOW?

The history of Valentine's Day and the story of its patron saint are shrouded in mystery. We do know that February has long been celebrated as a month of romance, and that St. Valentine's Day as we know it today, contains vestiges of both Christian and ancient Roman tradition. But who was Saint Valentine. and how did he become associated with this ancient rite?



One legend is that Valentine was a priest who served during the 3rd century in Rome. When Emperor Claudius II decided that single men made better soldiers than those with wives and families, he outlawed marriage for young men. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death.

Some claim that the Christian church may have decided to hold St. Valentine's feast day in the middle of February in an effort to "Christianize" the pagan celebration of Lupercalia, celebrated at the ides of February, or February 15. This was a fertility festival dedicated to Faunus, the Roman god of agriculture.

To begin the festival, priests, would gather at a sacred cave where priests would sacrifice a goat for fertility, then strip the goat's hide, dip them into the sacrificial blood and gently slapping both women and crop fields with the goat hide. Roman women welcomed this practice as they believed it made them more fertile in the coming year. References from www.history.com
