Thanksgiving Service



From Pastor Bill's Study

Greetings to all,



Several times during the last few days I have been thinking about prayer. Not just the reciting of grace at a meal type of prayer but to open myself up and speak up and out about what is on my mind.

By a very rough count, the word prayer or any derivative of the word prayer are found in *Strong's Exhaustive Concordance*, more than 500 times. So I guess it is a rather important concept within the work of God.

Yet there are times when I feel prayer has become an afterthought or even worse not even thought of at all. I recently read in a devotion that, "If life is getting to busy you can save time by not doing a devotion or prayer time to help you manage what time you have." This note was signed by Satan.

In the past I have read many books dealing with prayer and the ways in which to pray but what it truly comes down to is spending time with God.

Bill Hybels wrote several years ago a nice little book on prayer titled "Too Busy Not to Pray". There is useful information in this small book about our prayer life and how to grow in our prayer life. I also recommend reading anything from EM Bounds, or Dutch Sheets. First and for most I recommend the Bible as a great source of study on prayer. If so lead you can use the verses in the Bible as a daily devotion and though starter on your prayers for the day.

After finishing the Revelation study I am more convinced of how much we as individuals and as the church need to be in prayer for our self and for those who need to know a personal relationship with Yahshua the Messiah.

I cannot think of a time in my life where prayer has not more relevant and needed. We need the help and hope of Christ more and more every day.

With all that has been happening in my family and in the life of the church I see more and more the attacks of evil in this world we now live in without my relationship with Christ I am not sure how I would make it.




One of my prayers is that you also will see the need for prayer and God will light up your world as well.

Trustees Report...

There are a few items of interest to report from the Trustees this month.

Recently the Leadership Team approved Quick Dry Express to clean the carpets in the Sanctuary, the Fellowship Hall/Large Sunday School Room and the Elm Street Lounge at a cost of \$450. The cleaning has been completed and the carpets look much better.

In other news, the Leadership Team approved landscaping work around the church and Parish House. A proposal was received from Shaffer Landscaping in the amount of \$2,597.84. After discussion the Leadership Team recommended asking the landscape company who had done the work the previous year for a proposal. They declined because they were too busy. Therefore we approved the proposal from Shaffer's. The work has been completed and the shrubbery and grounds look very nice again.

Also, the annual Parsonage inspection was completed by Cindy Mohr and me on October 17. As usual since the McNeals have been living there, we found the house to be in very good condition. We noted a few minor items that should be addressed prior to a new Pastor moving in.

Another calendar quarter has passed, which means it's time for the quarterly report of the Trustee's finances.

The following balances (rounded) are as of September 30:

- Hudock Capital Group \$582,062 a decrease of \$7,365 from the last quarter We needed to transfer \$15,000 from this account for current expenses in the third quarter.
- Prudential Investments \$604,917 an increase of approximately \$3,500 from the last quarter

 this is our 'in lieu of flood insurance' account.
- Prudential Investments The Radenbush Trust \$92,654 an increase of a little over \$2,100 from last quarter.
- Prudential Investments \$8,154 an increase of \$573 from the last quarter.
- BYN Mellon The Butler Trust The quarterly statement had not arrived prior to the newsletter deadline. This balance will be reported at a later date.

Leadership Team (Ad Board) Report....

The devotions that began the October Leadership Team meeting centered on the concept of contentment, and on Proverbs 17:22. We may wonder what makes us content to live as we do, considering all that life throws at us – but it helps to remember that it's not what we lack, but what we have that counts. A strong faith, coupled with daily prayer, can give us the peace we seek. If we believe in a God who loves us, the troubles of this world aren't so scary. We are secure because God is our security, and we draw contentment from the trust we put in Him. There is strength in knowing that God placed us on earth to serve Him, because that gives us purpose. While worry, self-pity and despair can all be (and so often are) a part of living, the key is how we respond to the cards we're dealt.

With those thoughts fresh on our minds, we shared some things that bring us contentment. Family and close friends, certainly, and, very often, life's simpler things. But there's also contentment in knowing that we've done good and produced value. Or in helping others. Or in morning devotions. Or in learning and creating. Even in relaxation. The list goes on, as they say, reminding us that many, many things can lead to contentment. If we let them.

The inspector from the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture recently paid our church a visit and basically told us that as long as we're not using our kitchen to prepare foods for public sale, the DoA doesn't need to license us. So we're free to use our facility for in-church purposes, and we still have our initial certification. But if we ever want to use the kitchen commercially, we'll need to be inspected again.

T. Ross has been engaged to check the sanctuary window nearest to the Head Usher's station, said area having shown considerable evidence of interior framework and wall damage from insects. Work is under way.

We are considering whether we need new sound equipment for the main sanctuary, because were having an increasing number of problems with the present setup. Susquehanna Valley Sound and Video will be enlisted to give us a proposal for a whole new system.

Bethany's Contemporary sanctuary will again be used by the Salvation Army to conduct its bicycle giveaway closer to Christmas.

The Coat Giveaway that we conducted earlier in October goes on, in the sense that we're still filling "orders" for items requested but not then available.




