Leadership Team / Lay Leader Report

Next Leadership Team Meeting: Tuesday, July 20th, 6:30 pm.

The regular monthly Leadership Team meeting for June was canceled, but in a special gathering on June 13 the Team voted to have the Parish House roof and rain gutters replaced by Hillside Roofing of Allenwood. Hillside has already been sent a down payment on the job, which will provide the office building with metal roofing that has a 40-year guarantee. It only remains for the Team to select the colors of the material and for the roofers to tell us when they can start.

Meanwhile, Rod Moore reports that he has enrolled in an eleven-week on-line Wesley Lay Academy course that is planned to start on September 27. Completion of this offering by the Wilke Institute for Discipleship will satisfy Rod's requirement to support his Lay Speaker Certification for another three years (2022 – 2025). The Lewisburg District office has confirmed that this elective course is eligible as a qualifier, and the Director of District Lay Servant Ministries is aware of Rod's impending engagement with it.

Rod was more than glad to take the Bethany pulpit on Sunday, June 20 following the last service given by Pastor Bull McNeal on June 13. Gary Anspach, a former member and Lay Speaker for the church is giving the sermon on June 27, and on July 4 Pastor Travis Allshouse, our newly-appointed ecclesial leader, will take charge of our collective worship.

By the time you're reading this, a new signature card will have been completed for Bethany which reassigns signatory authorizations on church checks and inter-account transfers at Milton Savings Bank. This is a move made necessary by the departure of Pastor McNeal, the arrival of Pastor Allshouse, and the need to realign and streamline signer eligibility.

Rod was extremely pleased to be able to host two high-level officers from the United Lutheran Seminary on June 7. The visitors were Rev. Dr. Guy Erwin, the Seminary's President, and Rev. Dr. Martin Otto Zimmann, Director of Church Relations. These fine gentlemen and good friends were able to tour the inside of the rapidly-progressing "new Bethany", and they were quite impressed with what they saw.

We were so very pleased that our own Megan Snyder became an honors graduate of Lycoming Collee in recent days. It's hard to believe how quickly her four years at Lycoming passed, but what a wonderful time it was for her and her mother Amy, her grandmother Linn Chesney, all her friends, and all of her church family. Megan has been invited to grace the walls of the renovated church's nursery with artistry of her own choosing, and we'll be anxious to see what she does when the opportunity comes.



Community Dinner Ministry June 13, 2021 Re-Launch Report

On Sunday, June 13th, 2021, the Milton Community Dinner Ministry very successfully re-launched our Community Dinners as drive-up/take-out from the Christ Lutheran Church/St. Paul's UCC location on Mahoning Street and also delivery service to The Milton Towers. Several volunteers from The Milton Lutheran Parish, St. Paul's UCC, St. Paul's AME Church, and myself as the sole volunteer from Bethany (and the 'Defacto Chair' of the Ministry) worked in harmony to prepare, package, deliver, and transport a total of 150 meals to food insecure members of the community and volunteers. Excess/leftover meals and food items were delivered to the Milton Developmental Services facility at Arch & Walnut to be enjoyed by the 35 residents there, which they were extremely grateful for. For our next meal, we are adding the residents there to our delivery rotation as well, as like the residents of the Towers, they do not have transportation to our location.

Special thanks to Sharon Foust, Dorothy Hower, & Shelly Sholley for donating croutons and salad dressing. The remainder of the supplies and salad fixings were purchased with money from The Price Hardship Fund due to lack of food donations from the congregation. I mention this because in order for our church to best participate in this ministry, it requires congregational participation in the form of either donations of food or money toward the purchase of the food/supplies, and most importantly, volunteer time commitments.

Our next meal will take place on Sunday, August 8, 2021 at 5:00pm and will again be offered as drive-up & delivery. In the past, Bethany has taken the Lead on this meal providing hamburgers, hot dogs, and rolls, however, at this time we are discussing serving hamburger BBQ as the main entrée for convenience of preparation, however, this will be discussed at our next Planning Committee Web Meeting which is tentatively scheduled for Thursday, July 8th, 2021 at 7:00pm. I will share the meeting link when details are firmed up. Other meal dates for this year are October 10, 2021 and December 5, 2021. I hope you will prayerfully consider participating in this important ministry that is so vital to our Community, especially in these times where so many struggle financially and with food insecurity.

Trustees Report

As reported last month the Treasurer projected that we'd need another \$10,000 in early June to meet our current expenses. The funds were transferred to the general checking account during the first week in June. In addition, at the June Leadership Team meeting it was decided that we would soon need the funds that were invested with Hudock Capital from the first insurance proceeds check we received after the fire. The whole balance (approximately \$350,000) was transferred to the fire restoration account at Milton Savings.

There was a lot of work around the parsonage prior to and during the move out of the McNeals and the Allshouse family moving in. The roof, gutters and downspouts were replaced, and the flooring in the laundry room and one of the bathrooms was replaced prior to the McNeals moving out. After the McNeals moved out, and before the Allhouse family moved in, the staff of Servpro performed a thorough cleaning, shampooed the carpets, cleaned the ductwork and performed a disinfectant fogging of the entire house.

The Leadership Team has been discussing the need to replace the roof, gutters and downspouts on the Parish House. We received three proposals. At a special meeting of the Leadership Team following worship service on June 13, it was decided to approve the lowest cost proposal (\$20,724), which was from Hillside Roofing, the same company that replaced the roof on the parsonage. The roof will be a metal roof. The Leadership Team will need to choose a color for the roofing material. Hillside Roofing said the job will probably be scheduled for some time in August.


