Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) has partnered with local governments and community agencies to implement Energy Watch Programs. Energy Watch Programs deliver comprehensive energy evaluations and retrofit projects to local governments, nonprofit organizations, special districts and small to large sized businesses in Sonoma, Napa, Solano, Mendocino, Lake and Marin Counties. Increasing energy efficiency not only benefits the environment by conserving our natural resources and reducing air emissions, it saves money!

To ensure that customers receive the most comprehensive service possible, the Energy Watch Program provides energy education and personalized technical assistance as well as referrals to other applicable programs.

Eligibility Requirements

Eligible types of businesses may include: assembly, retail, light industrial, food service, light manufacturing, office buildings, storage, warehouse facilities, grocery, health/medical, lodging, special districts, nonprofits and municipalities. The program is designed to address the needs of small, medium and large sized commercial customers with an energy demand of 0–500 kW monthly demand. 75% of customers served must be within the counties listed below, while 25% can be from anywhere within PG&E's service territory.

Eligible geographical areas include, but are not limited to:

- Solano County
- Sonoma County
- Lake County
- Napa County
- Mendocino County
- Marin County

Energy Efficiency Measures

The program covers many energy efficiency measures including:

Lighting:

- Select LED Technologies
- High Performance T8/T5 Retrofits
- High Bay Replacements
- Exterior Lighting

Refrigeration:

- ECM (Electronically Commutated Motor /High Efficiency Evaporator Fan Motors) for cooler and freezer display cases
- Anti-Sweat Heater (ASH) Controls

HVAC:

- PTAC/PTHP (Hotel/Motel) Controls
- VFD's for HVAC Fans
- Economizers, ADEC and CO2 Sensors
- Economizer Controls
- High Efficiency Small Gas Storage Water Heater
- HVAC Enhanced Vent Gas Heat

Support from Start to Finish

Contact your local Energy Watch Program to enroll. A program representative will explain the process in detail and determine how the Energy Watch Program can best serve your needs.

Steps to Participation:

1. Sign an Access Agreement. We will complete a *no-cost, no-obligation* energysurvey of your facility.
2. Your project manager provides a report summarizing:
 - Recommended energy efficiency measures
 - Estimated project cost
 - Incentive levels
 - Estimated energy and cost savings
 - Simple payback and estimated greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction
3. Complete a Program Participation Agreement for the measures you decide to implement. You will receive referrals to qualified electrical contractors.
4. Your project manager provides technical support, handles paperwork, and gives project oversight as contractors complete the work.
5. Your project manager conducts a post-installation verification survey to confirm that the measures have been installed properly and to assure customer satisfaction.
6. Energy Watch can refer you to additional programs offered by PG&E, or to other vendors, and can also assist you in your pursuit of Green Business Certification.
