

Check on the website www.off-road.com. It's a Las Vegas based site that covers all forms of OHV recreation, from bikes to jeeps. Right now, it has the review of the new KTM 4-strokes, which includes the "Product and Sales Knowledge Report," a report that goes to dealers to inform them on the bikes they sell. It concludes by saying, "If you hear anything that closely resembles dual purpose, street, road, etc., in your discussion with a potential RFS purchase, do him a favor and steer him to an LC4." Wow. One, I appreciate their honesty and secondly, these are serious motorcycles.

Have you heard about the Ozark 100 Dual Sport Ride? On April 2 there is a 100 mile dual sport ride at Jerusalam, AR. Bikes are required to have a valid license plate, a working headlight and taillight and a USFS-approved spark arrestor. Your bike must also past a sound test. 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




Mike,

I can't stress enough how important ORV recreation is to me. My vacations center around off-roading. Most weekends are spent out in the woods in National Forests on my motorcycle. The roadless initiative proposed will impact millions of acres of public land. Not only will this initiative exclude many people from a valid recreational activity, it will have significant economic impact to the areas made roadless.

I am chairman of the communication committee of the Ozark Mountain Trail Riders Association, an association dedicated to off-road motorcycle and ATV recreation. We are based in Southwest Missouri. I understand that the Mark Twain National Forest and our local riding area, the Chadwick Motorcycle and ATV use area, will not be impacted by this initiative, but many of our members travel to many parts of the country to ride motorcycles and ATVs in National Forests that will be impacted.

I have been riding off-road motorcycles for over 25 years and have noticed that if trails are properly maintained, the environmental impact is minimal. We pay to have these trails maintained with use permits and the tax on the fuel we use in our vehicles while traveling on these trails. We also perform many hours of volunteer maintenance on the trails we ride.

Please tell me if there is anything else I can do to keep from being locked out of our public lands.

The February OMTRA meeting was held on the 17th at Buckinghams. The weather was not too good and neither was the turnout. Only about 20 members showed up.

This happened to be the meeting to invite Janet Fraley, an engineer with the Forest Service, to come and talk to us about the proposed changes at Chadwick. She came well-prepared, bringing a host of documents concerning Chadwick, including a copy of the original legislation signed by President Nixon in the '70's designating the Chadwick area as a motorcycle area.

She reassured us that the Forest Service is well aware of the type of trails needed and that they have no intention of creating "super highways" that will encourage high speeds and carelessness. She encouraged our group to monitor the progress and report any problems to her personally. Dr. McKenzie also stated he will be there monitoring the work as much as possible.

Janet told us the last date for complaints about the proposed work is March 14. If that date passes without a protest, then the project is on. She believes there may be a protest or two, but that she has the research and documentation to prove "no harm to the existing environment." She enlightened us as to the incredible amount of research and reports that have been done on the Chadwick area, just to be able to improve the area. She added that the addition of the soon to be built bridges will help negate the argument of damage to the waterways as they prevent contact with the streams.

She did mention that ALL letters are read and do have an impact on Forest Service decisions. The squeaky wheel gets the grease, you know. She encouraged all members to write to the service in favor of the Chadwick area, even if it is just a simple note to say "We love it and want to keep it." All letters should be addressed

In other club business, Alan Haynes reported that the winter hare scrambles were so successful, they are thinking of trying to do some fall events. He expressed thanks to all those supporters and also to Bob and Linda Fuerst for their help and photography work. Riders at the events ranged from very new beginners to veteran "retired" riders. All the non-OMTRA members who raced will be receiving club information.

Casey talked about the status of the non-profit organization plans. He informed the club that the for-profit corp. will need to be dissolved and all offices either filled or dissolved. Club members agreed this switch is a positive move. Again, remember to keep some time open this summer to help with the Chadwick project.


