Course Overview

An active shooter is an person actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and other populated area. In most cases, active shooters use firearms and there is no pattern or method to their selection of victims. Active shooter situations are unpredictable and evolve quickly. The average active shooter incident lasts 2 - 10 minutes. All employees can help prevent and prepare for potential active shooter situations. This course provides guidance to individuals, including managers and employees, so that they can prepare to respond to an active shooter situation.

This course is written for non-law enforcement employees. The material provides recommended actions for non-law enforcement employees to take should they be confronted with an active shooter situation.

- 1 Describe actions to take when confronted with an active shooter and responding law enforcement officials upon their arrival.
- 2 Recognize potential workplace violence indicators.
