# From The Pastor's Desk

I've heard it many times. Maybe you've even said it yourself. "I hope this year is going to be better than last year was!"

Living in a world that's rapidly falling apart in terms of morals, security, freedom, sanity (among numerous other things) isn't pleasant. It's easy to become cynical, even bitter, over the way that everything is going in our lives, our nation, and across the planet.

With things seemingly spiraling out of control, we search for a place to put the blame. Faulting politicians for our problems doesn't ease our minds quite the way that it used to. So where should we be putting the blame for all our troubles and misery?

Some put the blame squarely on whites. Others blame blacks. Still others will say that it's the fault of all the "foreigners". Some blame religion. Others blame guns, or "climate change", or fracking, or young people, or old people, or capitalism. But ultimately (whether they come right out and say it or not) the blame always works its way down to one particular point – to God.

Why *shouldn't* God be blamed for our troubles, especially if He is all-powerful? Can't He stop the madness and make everything great? Isn't He supposed to be good?

Even though God lets some not-so-good things happen, (for whatever positive, all-knowing reason He may have – see Romans 8:28), He is not *responsible* for the lousy things that came our way in 2015. Nor is He responsible for the terrible things that will occur in 2016.

So if God isn't to blame, who is? We can point our fingers at the devil – after all, Satan is the one who stands behind all that is bad, and nasty, and painful. But, in all honesty, we can't blame Satan alone for "a bad year". He had some help.

Some of the blame for the lousy things that have happened during the previous year (and every year before that) has to fall on us. We may not be directly at fault, but we can't stand around trying to innocently point the finger in every other direction other than our own.

Did we speak up to correct a wrong? Did we do enough to care for someone in need? Did we live the way that God wants us to live – holy, blameless? Did we submit our will and wants to God's good and perfect will, or did we live like we are the unaccountable masters of our own destiny?

No, there isn't anyone who is righteous in this world – not a single one of us. But God knows that, and that's why He's given us something to make 2016 better.

God has given us a second chance. He has given us forgiveness. He has given us His Son.

2016 not only promises to be a new year, but it also promises to be a time of new creation. The apostle Paul writes: **Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation.
