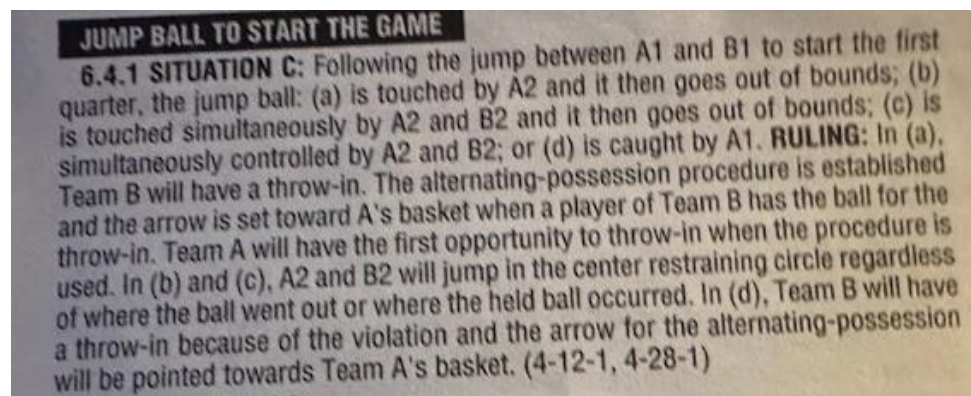


Good morning!

This is time for the U1 (and U2 in a 3-person game) to observe the appropriate team in regard to potential fashion police issues and team offensive tendencies (like 'walking' into tree-point shots'). The R should be making sure the coaching box has appropriate markings at the baseline as well as the 28-foot line. The R should be making sure the chairs for each team are off the court enough for the coaching box to be utilized with the coach off the floor. Also, where are the fans walking in? Are they tracking salt and water in and close/onto the floor? We have plenty to do in the 15:00 leading up to the game, focus on those things the next 2 weeks!
