I was born and raised in the San Gabriel Valley of Southern California. In the mid-80s, my father and grandfather would take me fishing to Lake Silverwood, Big Bear Lake, and Puddingstone Lake. 



He had just put on a big surf fishing seminar the day before as a CCA fundraiser and was back out there at 7 a.m. with us.

I met Randy Mindoro at Big Tackle as we both needed items specific to Bill's list. Then it was new territory to discover.

We gathered in the parking lot. The location shall remain our secret. It was a place new to us. There was quite a berm and I received help from the lovely gentlemen I was with to get up and down it. The sand was shaded a dark color from oil from the ships. My buds that morning were Jose M and Jose L Dominguez and Randy Mindoro. Hubby was still on the DL.

We were all on time. we set up the tackle by the cars. Bill was quick to point out that we should have been ready to hit the water right away. Ok we blew that part. This was a 4 hour lesson and we missed part of it. He had a buddy named Ken that teamed us with us one on one after a group chat on the beach.

What surprised me was how different this lesson was compared to the other talks we have heard about surf fishing. Alot of new information was shared. I have heard SC surf fishing presenters many times and alot of this was new to me. We fished all morning. Jose M. was the first to hook up and got a surf perch. Randy was next with a small corbina. This beach reportedly was heavy with corbina sometimes, but not on this day. Ken and Bill were able to fish some on their own but THEY didn't catch anything at all. So I didn't mind when I came up empty handed too. BTW Randy took his picture thru a baggie.

Ken pointed out the beach glass to Jose and I. He gave me my first piece of real California beach glass too. Jose M (aka "Jr") soon caught on and was all over the beach for sand crabs and beach glass. He had some of both by 11 a.m.

I can't wait to get back out there and test my new skills. Bill told me another one of his secret spots so that might be next. He is also having Surf fishing seminars in July and September that are open to the public as CCA fundraisers. Check out his website if you are interested.





Aloha Spirit Trip May 5, 2018 By Glenn Bummer

Don Udlock and I arrived at Cisco's Landing in Oxnard approximately 4:00 am. Finally it was great to see many regular fishing buddies from Turners Rod and Reel Club participating on this fishing adventure with an added bonus for some who saw the Mars Spacecraft streak across the sky launched from Vandenburg Launch Range.

After sign in, boarding the Aloha Spirit which promptly left the dock at 5:00 am, we were informed that no live bait was available and we would be using cut squid for bait fishing for rockfish for starters. This really can make white seabass, yellowtail and calico bass tuff to catch without live bait for chum.

Crossing the channel was rock and roll with large swells, strong winds and unfortunately there was not enough galley seating for 18 people. Some of our anglers outside on deck were wet and uncomfortable during the crossing.

We finally arrived near the planned fishing location at 6:30 am and Captain Shawn Steward announced that we would not be fishing the desired location due to large swells and windy conditions. He'll try small Rocky stone location protected from wind / swells as it's shielded by Santa Cruz, Island.

When we started fishing I was surprised to see all the new types of fancy rubber lures and jigs being used. Fishing was a mix for reds, chuckleheads and grouper with numerous moves to various small stone locations.

The group kept plugging away ending up with many quality size rockfish for our efforts. We ended up with 180 rockfish and 1 sheephead.

I managed to catch a 6.8 lb. copper rockfish- chucklehead for the jackpot on my GB red shrimp fly that I hand made years ago.
