Lay Leader's Report

Members of PSPRC met twice in February with Larry Leland, Lewisburg District Supervisor (1) to discuss in depth the leadership needs of Bethany now that Pastor Damien is leaving us for his reassignment to the three-point North Towanda charge in the Williamsport District, and (2) to meet, welcome, and have initial discussions with William L. ("Bill") McNeal, the new pastor that the Conference has appointed for our church. Note that I will conduct our Traditional Sunday services in the late June period between the departure of Pastor Damien and the arrival in the pulpit of Pastor Bill, and that we'll invite a guest speaker to take care of our Sunday Contemporary sermons during that period.

I recently took advantage of an amazing opportunity to provide significant financial backing for a new prison ministry program in central Illinois, whereby new prison arrivals with inadequate means to open commissary accounts will be provided with kits containing basic toiletries to tide them over until they get established. The organization managing this effort is Crossroads of Life Prison Faith Community, Lincoln, IL (a UMC affiliate congregation), and the first institution to benefit from the effort will be the Logan Correctional Center, a women's facility in that city. (Lincoln is about halfway between Chicago and St. Louis, near Peoria).

The products needed to conduct the 2017 VBS were discussed in a January 25 meeting with cooperating church Christ Evangelical Lutheran, subsequently ordered, and received in mid-February (on a 20% discount, praise be), VBS will be held June 19 – 23 at the Christ Evangelical facility.

Bethany was honored to have one of its own, Thomas Bennage, return to speak to the congregations at both services on Sunday, February 5. Tom is now quite deeply involved with Methodist missions, and he's looking forward to a long and fruitful overseas trip in that regard that begins later this year. He has our prayers and our support as he embarks on the journey to which God has clearly called him.

Trustees' Report.....

At their February meeting the Trustees received a report from representatives of Prudential Investments (PruCo). The current value of the investment portfolio that the Trustees have set aside in lieu of having flood insurance was \$519,588. The Trustees goal is to maintain at least \$500,000 in this account for cleanup and repairs following the inevitable flooding that will occur sometime in the future. The Raudenbush Trust was currently valued at \$80,958. As most of you are aware, the principle of the trust cannot be used, but the income may, which, at the time, was \$4,667 of the value. There is one other small investment account, the current value of which was \$5,713.

Praise God! Although there is still some work to be completed in the old kitchen area, the bulk of the renovations to the basement are finished. The new handicapped accessible restrooms are fully functional and the Social Hall has a bright new look. The next phase of the renovation will be to create a new handicapped accessible restroom in the current restroom location in the rear of the church. Therefore, for a period of time, the only usable restrooms will be in the basement, and the Elm Street Lounge/Chapel will be inaccessible during this phase of the renovation project.

Although we've not been given a definite date, the folks from T-Ross Construction hope to start the renovation to the first floor of the Parish House around the middle of March. Hopefully the Pastor and staff can continue to use the current office while the other rooms on the first floor are being renovated.

Ad Board Report

Key Bethany financial personnel have been working together to reformat the church budget and monthly fiscal reporting statements to make them more amenable to the needs of the Board. The latest such documents are much improved in terms of categorical line item definition and transparency. We will give the new reportage system a couple of months to prove out.

Sample expense voucher slips specific to each church committee have also been put before the Board for evaluation. The new slips are formatted to enable more efficacious line item expense tracking.

We are switching electricity generation / transmission suppliers away from NRG Solutions and back to PPL. At prevailing rates, we anticipate that this will save the church an estimated \$1,400 over a typical four-season cycle.

The Board received and reviewed the dossier of Bethany's incoming pastor William McNeal. The Lewisburg District will approve Pastor Bill's salary at a near-future charge conference. On the subject of the imminent transition, we are assured that the Susquehanna Conference will pay 100% of the costs associated with Pastor Damien's move to North Towanda.

We have approved a St. Patrick's Day corned beef / cabbage meal at Bethany, which will most likely occur on the day itself, Friday, March 17.

We are planning a renewed effort to get more of our members certified in Safe Sanctuaries. More on this subject later.
