#### **Free Water Conservation Tools**

Austin Water offers free tools to help you save water. Some are available for pick up, while others can be checked out from the Austin Public Library.

Available for pick up Mon. – Fri. 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. at 625 E. 10th Street, 6th floor Limit one item each per residential customer.

**Showerhead** - save 2 gallons per minute or more with a water-efficient showerhead, available in either regular or soap-up valve models that only use 1.5 gallons of water per minute.

**Kitchen & Bathroom Faucet Aerator** - mix air with water to reduce the amount of water used without reducing water pressure. Bathroom aerators use 0.5 gallons of water per minute and kitchen aerators use 1.5 gallons per minute.

**Soil Moisture Meter** - measures the moisture of your soil to help you know when it's time to add water; available in ladybug or frog design.

Available for check-out at the <u>Austin Public Library</u> <u>Water Saver Hose Meter</u> - monitor and control water use with a digital meter attachment for garden hoses and hose-end sprinklers.

<u>Sunlight Calculator</u> - measure the amount of light each area of your yard receives, then use the included <u>plant</u> <u>guide</u> to select plants that best fit the light conditions.

## Garden Calendar — February

Prepare your yard and garden for spring!

- Clean, repair or replace garden tools.
- Prune evergreen shrubs, shade trees, fruit trees, grape vines, and summer and fall flowering shrubs.
- Prune repeat blooming roses around Valentines Day.
- Transplant bare root or container grown shrubs, roses, trees, groundcovers and vines.
- Prepare garden soil by adding compost or fertilizer and till deeply.
- Divide and transplant perennial herbs and summer of fall blooming perennials.
- Plant asparagus crowns, broccoli plants, cabbage plants, cauliflower plants, carrots, chard, onion bulbs, peas, potatoes, spinach, mustard, beets, collards, kohlrabi, lettuce, radish, and turnips.
