The Ladies Polo Auxiliary reaches extraordinarily high standards through the sport of kings. The organization has raised approximately \$250,000.00 since its founding in 2005. The funds raised benefit local charities to assist victims of domestic violence, sick children, and abandoned and abused children.

Dena Miller founded Ladies Polo Auxiliary with a handful of other polo wives, women polo players and friends of the sport. Her goal was to use her love for polo as a platform to raise awareness and money for worthwhile causes.

Dena has been fortunate enough to travel all over the world with her polo playing husband, but she always longed for a permanent local place for polo. In 2008 the Ladies Polo Auxiliary found their home when the Millers launched Prestonwood Polo and Country Club in Oak Point, Texas. Now polo players from all over the world play in the 380 corridor. The realization of this dream not only allows Dena to enjoy the sport she loves, but it offers a venue for her to support causes close her heart.

Since the opening of Prestonwood Polo and Country Club the LPA has used the site on several occasions to raise money for organizations such as The Family Place, Brian's House, Equine Therapy and The Children's Advocacy Group

The LPA has also been generous with assisting organizations with fund raising events such as the Aubry 380 Chamber of Commerce, Little Miss Main Street, and the area Boy Scouts by donating grandstands, season passes and day passes. The LPA has also worked hard to raise awareness for environmental issues by holding such events as Polo for the Planet.

They plan to host events to help with animal rescue next season.

Wendy Devineni and Nora Dhondt have been active with the LPA since 2008 and have put in countless hours to make the events highly successful. Coming up is Polo on the Midway. This event is family oriented and the LPA has gone to great lengths to make sure everyone will have a fabulous day. Polo on the Midway is on October 30, 2010, and all of the funds raised will benefit the Children's Advocacy Group of Denton County. Wendy and Nora have also provided underwriting as well as time to provide fun activities for the children attending Polo on the Midway. For the past two years, Nora and Dena have also hosted some of the international players of the Women's Championship Tournament, assisting them with lodging and other necessities in order to play in the corridor.

The WCT brings some of the best known names in women's polo to the corridor and the LPA is largely responsible for the enormous success. This year players from six countries played in the WCT. Besides raising money and awareness the LPA likes to have fun too, by planning events such as Polo and Petanque, celebrating the French culture.

Don't have Halloween plans yet? Or don't want to drive far from home for an exciting family festival? Wells Fargo Advisors is bringing "Polo on the Midway" on Saturday, October 30, 2010 at Prestonwood Polo Club in Oakpoint, TX, off on Yacht Club Road. Gates open 2:00-7:00pm. This fall festival will feature: carnival games, bounce houses, pony rides & petting zoo (as seen on Barney), vendors, Halloween costume contest, classic car show by Rolls-Royce Owners Club, stagecoach rides and most exciting of all-the "380Guide Community Challenge Cup Finals", a live polo match.

This event is hosted by the Ladies Polo Auxillary with all proceeds benefiting the Children's Advocacy Center for Denton County. The Advocacy Center works with law enforcement, the District Attorney's Office, Child Protective Services, and medical professionals on the investigation and prosecution of severe child abuse cases in Denton County. In 2009 alone, the center conducted 671 interviews of children suspected of being sexually abused, facilitated over 8,600 counseling sessions, and helped bring 109 perpetrators to justice.
