**Medium Trees: 30-40 ft. tall at maturity**

<i>Carpinus caroliniana</i>	American Hornbeam	X	35'	25'	gray beech-like bark, good fall color, PHS gold medal
<i>Carpinus betulus</i>	European Hornbeam		40'	30'	easy to grow
<i>Magnolia virginiana 'Green Mile'</i>	Green Mile Sweetbay Magnolia	X	35'	15'	fragrant white flowers in summer, good for butterfly larva, semi-evergreen

**Large Trees: >40 ft. tall at maturity (Root Area Larger than 4' x 6')**

<i>Gleditsia triacanthos 'Shademaster'</i>	Shademaster Honeylocust	X	50-70'	25-40'	small leaves provide dappled shade, good yellow fall color
<i>Quercus bicolor</i>	Swamp White Oak	X	60'	60'	acorns important wildlife food source, wet- and drought-tolerant
<i>Quercus phellos</i>	Willow Oak	X	70'	40'	acorns important wildlife food source, thin leaves
<i>Tilia americana 'Redmond'</i>	American Linden/Basswood	X	50-70'	30-40'	fragrant flowers in July, good for pollinators
<i>Tilia tomentosa 'Green Mountain'</i>	Green Mountain Silver Linden		65'	40'	dark green leaves w/silvery undersides, fragrant flowers in July for pollinators
<i>Zelkova serrata 'Green Vase'</i>	Green Vase Zelkova		60-80'	40-50'	vase shape, bronze fall color
