PENISTONE WI



OUR ENVIRONMENT MATTERS

Fair Green Future

You may have noticed when reading WI Life, that the WI has launched a new environmental campaign called Fair Green Future. Its aim is to call for a green transition that works for everyone.

Climate change affects us all but it doesn't affect everyone equally. Women and people from minority ethnic backgrounds are often most affected yet are not included in climate discussions and decision making. Community, inclusion and fairness are important to all WI members so the WI wants to make sure that all voices are heard.

It's important to have conversations about climate change and green solutions to find the right policies for our communities. The majority of people in the UK are concerned about climate change and want the government to take action. However, there are also false and misleading claims about climate measures that can confuse the debate and put progress at risk.

The first stage of this campaign is about gathering information on how WI members are affected by climate change. The second stage will be using the voice of the WI to call on decision makers to listen to communities and give them a say in shaping their future.
