

himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. ⁹The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.





The peace of Christ be with you always. And also with you.


We will not share the peace in a physical fashion, but from a distance. You may hold up your fingers in the peace sign or bow with your hands folded or hold your hand over your heart.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION


Come to Christ's banquet. Feast on God's gift of grace.
